Christ, what can you Give Him?

It was not to the throne room of a king, where he would have been received in solemn majesty, that Christ came that night. It was not to the packed inn where frantic serving maids ran in and out, answering the surly cries of hungry travelers. **It was to the starlit fields that He came** - the angel of the Lord - bringing with him the good news of a great joy for all people, even the shepherds.

We are told that they went as fast as they could to Bethlehem to see what had happened. **They found the Savior of the world with Mary and Joseph.** We are told that they reported what the angel had said to them and then went back to their fields. That is all we know they did, but we imagine more. **We see them kneeling in the straw, offering to the baby their worship and, perhaps, some simple gift.** We imagine everyone who came



kneeling down in adoration, humble and glad in the steamy darkness, laying before the Child some present.

What Can I Give Him?

We cannot imagine adoration without gift giving, and at Christmas we have the opportunity, by wise and honored custom, of expressing appreciation and love to others by offering them presents. **We offer to God our thanksgiving** for this "unspeakable gift," that little Child at whose birth angels

sang, a human being yet God, coming into the human scene for the sake of humans - all of us. **We think of that gift, and we thank Him!** But there is one other thing we may offer, something that perhaps seems of much less "use" to the world at large, and a meager present at best. Christina Rossetti's lovely carol reminds us of it: **"What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I**

"Him that cometh to Me, I will in no wise cast out" (John 6:37).

And then, would not Jesus also say, "the whole tenor of my life and death forbids this. Did I not die, **"the just for the unjust"** (I Peter 3:18) to bring sinners unto God?' Was it not for carrying out this great design that I lived and died? To what purpose have I lived and died, if I am to cast out any who come to Me for life? "

We cannot imagine the Lord Jesus Christ frustrating the design of His own life and death; deliberately making void the bloody sweat in Gethsemane, and the bitter agonies of Calvary; we cannot imagine His coming short of the full fruition of His sufferings, which He must do, if He reject a single soul, really willing to be saved in His own way. **Christ's life and death have a price in His own eyes, as well as in those of the Father, and of a soul.**

And would not the whole counsel and

will of the Father be overthrown, if Jesus cast out any poor believing soul? What was the counsel and will of the Father but; **That there should be a way made for sinners to come back to Himself and that whosoever believed should be saved!**

Now the question is, in whom but sinners is that counsel to be carried out? And how is it to be carried out but by their being certainly received? All of the Trinity work together to secure the safety of the man that comes to Christ. And we find this blessed assurance in His Holy

Word, **"Him that cometh to Me, I will in no wise cast out."**

Let no one be deterred by considerations of your past rejections. Jesus will never mention them. Where was He so rejected as in Jerusalem? And yet when He sent forth His apostles to evangelize the world, He said,

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The **PERSON.** 2 Thes. 2:9 "And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming; Even him, whose coming is after the workings of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders." His appearing is "after the working of Satan." He is to fit into the program Satan has for the seven years of Tribulation. Satan since he was removed

from Heaven has been working toward this end-time effort to control this earth. To be sure, he will stop at nothing to deceive through his "super-man."

Go into the bathroom and look into the mirror. You can see you face is dirty, but you cannot wash your face with the mirror. Mirrors are not made to wash our faces with. They are made to show us the dirt. The Holy Law was not given for salvation by keeping it, God's Law was given to show you and I that we are unholy, unrighteous and need saving.

Escape from Hell

You are on the track. I hear the thunder and rumble of the wrath of God as it comes hurrying on, and I cry, "Get off the track!" Receive Christ now! "The Lord Jesus shall be revealed from Heaven with His mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power" (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9). **He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him**" (John 3:36). 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WAS JESUS JUST A TEACHER, PROPHET OR GOD?

People often want to reject Jesus' claim to be God, yet feel comfortable enough to acknowledge Him historically, as a good teacher or even a spiritual prophet.

WHY?

Accepting Jesus as God implies accepting His teaching and prophecy. This makes some people very uncomfortable. After all, people don't want to be accountable to God. Nor do they want to humble themselves or become servants. And some people are caught up in a lifestyle that Jesus teaches against. Perhaps such people believe that they can justify their sinful ways if Jesus is not God...

JESUS: A GOOD TEACHER?

Could Jesus be a good teacher if all of His teachings were wrong? I don't think so! The religious teachers scoffed at Jesus' teaching because it often contradicted the multitude of man-made laws that they had added to Scripture. Yet everything Christ said was strictly Scripturally based. Today some reject Jesus because His teaching contradicts what they want to do or believe. Jesus' teaching goal was never to be a popular teacher. **It was to teach the truth.** Jesus also taught that He was God. Was He a good teacher? Or a fool? Or a liar?

JESUS: A GOOD PROPHET?

Today we will call almost anyone a prophet. Correctly predict the score of a soccer game, and someone might call you a prophet - no matter how many times you've failed. People like Nostradamus, Jeane Dixon, and others are all called prophets (by tabloid reporters, etc.) despite the fact that most of their predictions were wrong.

JESUS - MOCKED AS A PROPHET

When Jesus was being tortured by soldiers before crucifixion, they mocked His claim to be God by asking Him to prophesy (Mark 14:65). The soldiers were aware that 100-percent accurate prophecy was required as a sign of God for the Jews. The true prophet was always right!

In biblical times, prophecy in the name of God was extremely serious! In fact, if a prophet made just one prophecy that did not come true, he was put to death by stoning (Deuteronomy 18:20). **So could Jesus be a good prophet and also be wrong? NO!** He was one or the other.

WHY SHOULD WE ACCEPT JESUS AS GOD?

Some people think that believing in Jesus and being good are the secret to Heaven. The Bible says

otherwise. It says that religion, speaking in Jesus' name, and being good are of no value if Jesus doesn't know us through salvation. Knowing Jesus is more than just a belief about Jesus. It means repenting and accepting Jesus' sacrifice and His claims to be God.

JESUS SHOWS GOD'S LOVE FOR US

We are all separated from God by imperfection. Even the most righteous people have had unholy thoughts considered sinful by God (Matthew 5:28). Since God is perfect and holy, His requirement for an eternal, heavenly relationship with Him is perfection that no human can ever offer. So God provided an alternative method to rejoin us with Himself through one perfect sacrifice, forgiving all of our imperfections. The only way for God to have such a

perfect sacrifice was for God to fulfill it Himself. By sending His Spirit into Mary (Luke 1:35), God essentially came to earth in human form as Jesus, to be sacrificed and show His love for mankind (John 3:16). To fully appreciate God's love, we need to be aware of the excruciating pain and humility Jesus willingly suffered for many who hated (or now hate) Him.

REJECTING JESUS SHOWS OUR DISDAIN FOR GOD

Jesus can be rejected in two ways: (1) By a decision to reject Him or (2) by simply not accepting Him. **Knowing about Jesus, even believing the gospel story, is not accepting Him nor showing love for God.** Even demons and Satan believe the gospel (Mark 5:6-17). Love for God means acceptance of Jesus. It means turning our lives over to Him for guidance. The word used in the Bible for "believe" (as in John 3:16) literally means to trust, or have faith in. This means more than intellectual knowledge. Imagine the disdain we show God by not accepting His very precious and loving sacrifice.

ACCEPTANCE OR REJECTION IS FOR ETERNITY

The Bible frequently reveals God's judgment. This does not conflict with God's love and forgiveness, most emphatically shown through the sacrifice of His Son. But it does reveal that God is just. **In the end, the Bible clearly states that there will be a separation of those who trusted Jesus as God, and those who didn't.** This separation is forever (Luke 13:23-30; Revelation 20:12-15).

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would bring a lamb. If I were a wise man, I would do my part. **What can I give Him - give Him my heart.**"

How am I to do this? Some measure of trust and commitment is involved in the giving of any gift. When a child offers some crushed wildflowers to his mother, he is confident that his mother can be trusted to joyously receive his gift... Laying my heart before Christ the Lord would be unthinkable without that same confidence felt by the child-assurance of acceptance. **"God so loved the world that He gave His one and only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him shall not perish but shall have everlasting life"** (John 3:16).



His Gifts to Me

I bring then, my heart an unopened parcel. No one else knows what it contains, but I know there is nothing there like gold, frankincense, or myrrh. There is nothing in the parcel except the panic, the fear, and the chaos of whatever storm buffets me now. But I find to my amazement that I am given something in return-peace, the peace of God that passes all understanding.

I bring my sins, for they too are contained in the parcel. And I receive in exchange forgiveness. "For he hath made Him (Jesus) to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the right-eousness of God in Him" (2Corinthians 5:21). It is a tremendous mystery. Out of our chaos comes this peace that

Christ gives to us Himself. How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is given! So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of His Heaven. No ear may hear His coming, but in this world of sin, where meek souls will receive Him still, the dear Christ enters in **"But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name"** (John 1:12).

No gift in the world compares with God's gift of salvation through His only begotten Son! Jesus said in Mark 8:36, 37, **"For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?"**

All the gifts given since the beginning of time and all that will be given until the return of Christ do not compare with God's Gift to the world- "His only begotten Son." To have this Gift is to have eternal life.

The Bible says in I John 5:12, **"He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life."** One may own everything else in the world; but when he dies, he leaves it all. On the other hand, one may not own one single item, yet if he has Jesus Christ when he dies, he has gained everything worth having; everlasting life in Heaven where there is no sickness, no pain, no sorrow, no death, no sighing, and no separation! 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"beginning at Jerusalem" (Luke 24:47).

Let no one be deterred by **considerations of present sinfulness.**

Jesus knows your nature; **"He came not to call the righteous but sinners to repentance"** (Mark 2:17). He takes you, in your poor sinful nature, just as you are; and will gradually make you what He would have you be.

Leave it to Him, by His Spirit, to make you what He would have you be; you can no more sanctify, than you can justify yourself! With your present sinfulness, and present sins, just come to Him!

on earth. Whom did He ever send away unhealed? **Not one.** Were any closed eyes left unopened? Were any deaf ears left unstopped? Was any arm left shrivelled? Was any foot allowed to halt? Who was sent away unfed? Who uncleaned? **Not one!**

Saved From What?

Perhaps you have been asked, "Are You Saved?" Many people that are sincere and have good intentions simply misunderstand the doctrine of salvation. To some, they mock and ask, **"Saved from what?"** The Word of God is our only authoritative source to answer such questions. We are saved or rescued from the eternal flames of Hell that await all unbelievers. **"...He that believeth not is condemned already..."** (John 3:18). God has forewarned those who do not believe in His plan of Salvation will be rejected from His presence and sent to a devil's Hell.

You say, "That's not fair! What did I do? I'm not so bad!" Perhaps according to our standards, our opinions of comparing one another, you are not so bad. Yet, by God's measure of sinless perfection, you and I are both sinners. The Bible teaches that all men are born sinners by their nature.

Dogs do not fly like birds, and birds do not swim like fish. A bird flies because it is his nature to fly, and likewise the fish swims... Man sins because he inherited the sinful nature of Adam. **"Wherefore as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned"** (Rom. 5:12).

Now the question arises, "How are you saved from God's judgment?" The Phillipian jailor asked that question in Acts 16:30, and the Apostle Paul's answer was very clear, **"Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved..."** (vs. 31). Paul did not issue a big list of deeds to perform; he simply told the jailor to put his trust in Jesus Christ. If our good works saved us, then there was no reason for our Lord Jesus to suffer and die on the cross. But again, the Bible teaches that, "Christ died to save sinners".

All of your good works could never pay the price of your sin debt because, "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life, through

Jesus Christ our Lord" (Rom. 6:23). To believe on Christ is to place your trust in Him completely. The Bible says in James 4, "You believe there is one God, you do well, the devils believe and tremble". This belief, or acknowledging the existence of Christ, is not the saving faith that applies trust to belief.

A man believes that a certain man can pilot an airplane, in fact, he may be sure of it, having seen him do it several times at the airport. **But it is quite another matter to enter his airplane and fly away!** Then I place my trust in the pilot because I can do nothing; my life is in his hands.

The religious people believe in the historical person of Christ but like an untrusting spectator at the airport, they refuse to put their destiny in the hands of another.

Christ says, **"Come unto Me..."!** But the religious person puts his trust in his own personal belief system to get himself to Heaven. To him, it appears better than resting in Christ's finished work. Church rituals and acts of kindness may seem like the way of salvation, but not according to the Holy Scriptures. **"There is a way that seemeth right unto a man but the end thereof are the ways of death"** (Proverbs 16:25).

Jesus said, "I am the Way, the truth, and the life and no man cometh unto the Father but by Me" (John 14:6). How about you? Is your faith and trust in Christ above? Remember the Scripture, "For by grace are you saved, through faith, and that not of yourselves, **it is the gift of God, not of works** lest any man should boast" (Eph. 2:8,9). That's the Word of God! Why not bow your head and pray for Christ to forgive you of your sins and to come into your heart and change your life!
