"Send out Thy light and Thy truth: let them lead me." Ps. 43:3

«For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation...» (Romans 1:16)

WHO ARE YOU LOOKING AT?

"Look unto Me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else" (Isaiah 45:22).

Most religions do not teach that a person is saved by looking unto Jesus or trusting Jesus. That teach that the person is put into a position to be saved, to go to Heaven, provided he or she does certain other things. But the text says, "Look unto Me, and be ye saved.." It does not say, "Look unto Me, and I will put you in a position to be saved provided you endure to the end, provided you don't sin again, provided you get baptized, provided you join the church, or provided you keep the Ten Commandments." The text plainly says, "Look unto Me, and be ye saved." A man is not saved as long as he is in danger of being lost.

Suppose a man is drowning in a lake and I swim out to save him. If I bring him within ten yards of the shoreline and abandon

him, is he saved? Absolutely not! **He is not saved until I pull him completely out of the water and rescue him from the danger of drowning.** When we look to Jesus, we are not put in a position to be saved; we are saved, we are rescued from the danger of being lost.

"Look unto me, and be ye saved." Saved from what? Saved from Hell! If I trust Jesus as my Saviour, I won't have to go to Hell when I die. I'll go to Heaven and be there forever and ever and ever. **To look to Christ means to have faith in Christ, to depend on Christ, to rely on Christ** the same way you rely on your family doctor, the same way you rely on your dentist, the same way you rely on an airplane pi-

lot. It means you have confidence in Him that He is all He offers Himself to be.

Your doctor says, "**I have studied medicine. I can diagnose your case. I can tell**

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CHRIST became POOR so You could become RICH

Jesus said to His disciples, "**The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay His head**" (Matt. 8:20). A person who "**has not where to lay his head**" reminds us of poverty in greatest degree. We have the poor with us always (Matt. 26:11); but how many people do we know who are so poor they have no place to lay their head when the sun goes down—no roof to shelter them? Let us study the poverty the Lord Jesus accepted in order to keep sinners out of Hell through the riches of His grace.

He became poor in possessions: Consider the home into which Jesus was born. How much of this world's goods did Mary and Joseph have? Our Lord was not born in a mansion nor in a well-equipped hospital. He was not laid in a soft bed amid silks and fine linen. The circumstances surrounding His birth were the most hum-

ble ever recorded in the pages of history: He was born in a sheep barn, wrapped in swaddling clothes, and His first baby-crib was a manger! He stepped from the splendor of Heaven to the poverty of earth that WE might step from sin to salvation. He exchanged the singing of the angels for the bleating of sheep. Yes, beloved-Jesus stepped from Heaven's splendor and riches to the poverty of earth, that WE through His poverty might become rich!

He became poor in glory: Jesus left the glory He had with the Father. He stepped from the ivory palaces into this poor, wretched world of sin. Only a meager few recognized His significant birth, and for many years He was unknown and unheralded by man. "**He was in the world . . . and the world knew Him not. He came unto His own, and His own received Him not**" (John 1:10,11). Even when the crowds followed

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The Mercy of GOD



"It is of the LORD'S mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is Thy faithfulness" (Lamentations 3:22,23). Think about that verse...

In August of 1976 I stood before a federal judge, pled guilty for smuggling 1,800 pounds of marijuana in a small airplane from Mexico... I confessed my guilt to the judge in the court room and asked for his mercy. I told him I

was guilty, that I was sorry and I didn't want to waste the court's time or money. I said, "**I'm at your mercy**, whatever you feel is appropriate will be fine..." it was a serious situation, my earthly destiny was in the judge's hands.

But just earlier that same morning, in a hotel room I had bowed down on my knees before the JUDGE of this Universe, and told the Lord Jesus Christ I was guilty of sinning against Heaven. I told the Lord I had heard that He was the Way and I was going the wrong way... **I asked Him to be merciful upon me, a sinner and invited Him into my heart life!** And His mercy changed me forever.

The Bible is very clear on the doctrine of the **Depravity of Mankind**. We understand that all of humanity stands guilty before our righteous God. Every one of us has broken His laws! Isaiah puts it this way; "**All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way...**" **It means we are all guilty!** "**...and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all**" (Isaiah 53:6). **That's His mercy!**

The apostle Paul said in Romans 6:23, "**For the wages of sin is death...**" **Now that's judgment!** "**...but the gift of God is eternal life through**

Jesus Christ our Lord." **But the gift of God is MERCY!** Mercy is "to have pity on," or to "show compassion"...

Twenty six times in Psalms 136 the Word of God declares unto us, "**...for His mercy endureth for ever.**" Be thankful that the LORD'S mercies and His His compassions never fail. Be grateful that His mercies upon you and I are new every morning!

GOD IS RICH IN MERCY!

Take a minute, stop and **Think About This Past Week.** Did you ever lose your temper? Did you have any evil thoughts? Did you do something you shouldn't have? Listen, we're all guilty: impatience, jealousy, envy, pride... Romans chapter seven explains our struggle with the flesh, "**For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do**" (Romans 7:19). All Christians battle the with their fleshly nature, it's part of being human... And yet the Lord is merciful and longsuffering.

Now, if you know Christ, think about before you were born again. "**Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power**

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The Whole Duty of Man

Ecclesiastes 12:13: **"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man."**

Fear God - This is the message of the book of Proverbs as well as Ecclesiastes. This means to reverence, worship, and obey Him. These are wise things to do as we fear God. For Cain it meant bringing a lamb. For Abraham it meant believing the promises of God. For us it is to **"Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved..."** Acts 16:31. Our sins are either on Christ by faith in Him, or else we must come before the Great White Throne for judgment.

We are instructed to "remember thy Creator in the days of thy youth:..." That is one of the reasons our church buses all these young people in here on Sunday. That is why we operate a Christian School. To introduce the gospel to them and train them in the ways of the Lord. Why? Well, for a very definite reason: because in the matter of salvation your chances of being saved are greater. Statistics show that more come to Christ when they are young. This does



not mean that old people cannot accept Christ. It is never too late.

Another good reason for young people to accept Christ is that they have a lifetime to offer to God in service to Him. Think of the young people mentioned in the Bible who had something to give to God: Joseph, Moses, Gideon, David, Jeremiah. Saul of Tarsus, and Timothy. What role models they are for our young people! Many young people have become great preachers as well as great missionaries. I stress and remind everyone that young people are the future of Christianity.

There is no answer to the problems of life without Jesus Christ. He is the only solution to the problems of life. The Lord Jesus gave His promise to people of any and all ages when he said **"All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out."** John 6:37. What a promise from the Lord himself!

So, should we not practice the "Whole Duty Of Man" and spread the gospel by obeying and following his commandments?

of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience" (Ephesians 2:2). We all followed our leader, the Devil. We each had our personal life styles outside of Christ. **"Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others"** (Ephesians 2:3). God was merciful to draw Believers to Him. Actually, we all deserve to go to Hell! Thank God He put up with us! **"But God, WHO IS RICH IN MERCY, for His great love wherewith He loved us. Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved)"** (Ephesians 2:4,5).

Think About your own view of mercy. There are several people that you and I would give up on because we run out of mercy. Our patience and compassion for one another as humans is quite limited. When we see folks fail, fall or disappoint us, we often become judgmental and/or give up on them. But God is longsuffering. **"... Because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning..."** God is rich in mercy, but how can we appropriate that to us?

GOD'S MERCY RECEIVED!

In the days of Christ many people came to Christ personally to receive mercy for their physical infirmities. **"And when Jesus departed thence, two blind men followed him, crying, and saying, Thou Son of David, have mercy on us"** (Matthew 9:27). We find mercy was given from the hands of the Master, when the Lord touched their eyes and they were opened! Many other occasions the multitudes would come and, **"... and cried unto Him, saying, Have mercy on me, O Lord, thou Son of David..."** Imagine that, imagine seeing Jesus moved with compassion on these individuals.

In the days of the Old Testament mercy was pursued through a God ordained ritual. The high priest would take a sacrificial spotless lamb, slay it for the blood to go into the Holy of Holies, an inner chamber in the Tabernacle/Temple and sprinkle it over **the Mercy Seat**. If God accepted their blood sacrifice the children

of Israel would receive mercy. Their sins would be atoned for one year.

But thank God for His mercy now in our day! We don't have to sacrifice a lamb or go find a Jewish priest when we sin. **"Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession"** (Hebrews 4:14). You may mess up your life like the prodigal son, or you may deny Christ like the apostle Peter, **but if you repent, you can always bow in prayer before the mercy seat of God. "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need"** (Hebrews 4:16). Remember, **"It is of the LORD'S mercies that we are not consumed, because HIS COMPASSIONS FAIL NOT. They are new every morning: great is Thy faithfulness"** (Lamentations 3:22,23).

GOD'S MERCY REFLECTED BY HIS CHILDREN!

Let me remind you if you are on your way to Heaven today, it is because of the mercy of God! **"Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to HIS MERCY he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost"** (Titus 3:5). If you're saved today, reflect and share that mercy by telling others about the Saviour. Since God puts up with us and blesses us in spite of our failures, we should proclaim the merciful loving Heavenly Father to our friends, relatives and others.

The apostle Paul challenges believers because of God's mercy. **"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the MERCIES of GOD, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service"** (Romans 12:1). If you have food to eat, praise Him! If you can see with your eyes, praise Him! If you have a roof over your head at night, praise Him! **God has been merciful to us as sinners! Let us reflect His mercy so that it will glorify our Father which is in Heaven.**

If you have never trusted Christ as your personal Saviour perhaps right now would be a good time for you to pray like the man in Luke 18:13, **"And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, GOD BE MERCIFUL TO ME A SINNER"**.

The Nature of Sin

The originator of sin is the Devil. He is a liar and the deceiver of mankind. It is his business to "cover up" the true nature of sin. What is the one word which describes the most of men and women in our day? If I were to ask for one word that would describe the heart of most people, that word would be **SIN**. Never has sin had so much control as today. Never have lives been marked by sin as much as they are today!

In considering the nature of sin, the prophet Isaiah states that **SIN SEPARATES**. The very nature of sin is separation. In Isaiah 59:2 we are told, "**But your iniquities have separated between you and your God...**" The separating wall between the sinner and a holy God, is the wall of sin. The thing that separates nations from God is sin.

In the religious thinking of our day, we have it in our hearts that we can live any kind of life and God will never turn His back upon us. This idea is wrong! Any nation or person with sin in their heart will pay for that sin by having God turn His back upon them. We have called black white, and evil good.

Then too, sin in its nature **DEFILES THE HEART**. In verse 3 of Isaiah chapter 59, "**Your lips have spoken lies, your tongue hath muttered perverseness**". The Word of God declares that out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks. Behind those lips that speak lies and the tongues which mutter perverse things is a heart defiled by sin. Every profane word uttered, every lie spoken, every idle word comes from a heart **DEFILED** by sin. Oh, for the need of new hearts. What can make the blackened heart of a sinner clean? Nothing but the blood



of Jesus. When the defiled heart has been cleansed by His precious blood, praises will come forth from the heart. Speaking lies will turn to singing praises, muttering perverses will turn to words of glory.

Sin in its nature **BLINDS THE SINNER**. Verse 4, "**... they trust in vanity...**" Sinners have been blinded to the extent that they trust in uncertain things. CHRIST became POOR so You could become RICH

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and acclaimed Him in the early days of His public ministry, they followed Him only for gain-for the loaves and fishes, for the healing of their bodies, for the spectacular miracles He performed. They were not there when He was nailed to the cross!

He became poor in His Person: From the riches of His Person with the Father, Jesus stepped to the poverty of a person among men. He was the express image of the Father, He was full of grace and truth; but men did not recognize Him as such. They admitted that He had no sin. They admitted that never man spake" like THIS Man spoke. They did not deny that He taught with authority, and not as the scribes. Pilate thrice confessed that he could find no fault in Jesus. Yet His enemies accused Him of being in partnership with the devil. They said He cast out devils by the power of the devil. They hired false witnesses to testify against Him at His trial. They would not admit that He was the Son of God!

His back was cut with the Roman lashes, His beard plucked out by the roots. His head was crowned with a crown of thorns, His hands and feet were torn with the spikes that nailed Him to the cross. His side was pierced with a Roman spear. He died the most shameful death known in His day - and He died that death that you and I might be spared the eternal death of the sinner. It is through HIS death that WE have life. **It is through His poverty that the riches of His grace are made possible for US.** Do you KNOW Him, as your personal Saviour?

He was poor in His separation from God: As the Lord Jesus hung on the cross, He became poor in His separation from the Father. During His earthly ministry He was in close relationship with God every step of the way; but when the sins of the world were placed on Him at Calvary, He cried in agony, "**My God! My God! Why hast thou forsaken me?**" God literally turned His back on Jesus while He paid the



penalty for your sins and mine. A holy God cannot look upon sin, and His Son was paying the sin-debt for the whole world-past, present, and future. He paid a tremendous price for our salvation; He paid with every drop of His precious blood. But more than that, **He paid by not being able to see His Father's face nor feel His Father's presence.**

“And many more believed because of His own word. Then they said to the woman; Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard Him ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world” (John4:41,42).

First of all, the Samaritan woman said: **“Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did.”** She knew that the man who talked to her was the Christ. If she said, **‘come I found Christ’** no one would have believed her. Jesus performed many miracles among the Jews. In spite of that they went on with hardened hearts, and even nailed Him to the cross.

Jesus preached in Samaria only two days and “many” hearts accepted Him and professed their faith. Only two days passed since their conversion but they had a great understanding of the truth and said: **“Saviour of the world.”** This Saviour of the Samaritan women and men is also our God!

Is He your Savior? In Matthew 9:36-37 says: **“But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd. Then saith He unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few”.**

Let us also pray. There are also today souls waiting to hear the voice of salvation but there is no one to tell them about it.

You SHALL Bow Before Christ One Day...

“That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father” (Philippians 2:10,11).

Some things are unavoidable, they are inevitable and are «as certain as death». The Scripture declares to all mankind, **“It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment”** (Hebrews 9:27).

Men must stand before God and be judged for their sin. Non-believing men, men who will have already tasted the torments of the damned in Hell, these too all must stand before God in judgment.

Warning after warning has fallen from the mouth of God to all about judgment and the result of sin. Therefore, **I beg you dear reader, to consider your destiny!** You have a soul that must spend eternity somewhere, you are going either to **Heaven** or to **Hell**, and you must give an account to God.

But thank God, you don't have to fear, my



friend. If you will trust in Christ, you can escape that judgment. Revelation 20:6 says, **“Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years”.**

You can have mercy instead of justice if you trust in Christ.

John 5:24 teaches us that, if you will trust in Christ, you will have no judgment, no condemnation, no second death. There Jesus said, **“Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that heareth My word, and believeth on Him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life”.**

Christ bore your sins. He took your place. He is even now at the right hand of the Father to intercede for those who trust Him.
