Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do?

Did you ever wonder why you were born, or what you are supposed to be doing with your life? The age old question arises. **"What is the purpose of man?"** The Bible teaches that man was created to glorify God. **"All things were created by Him, and for Him"**. Most people are so self-absorbed, they neglect to take time to acknowledge God or His purpose and plan for their life. I was once like that...

Born in Miami, Florida I never went to church growing up. I didn't believe in God and I mocked Christians. Moving to Colorado, in 1975 my life dramatically changed. I was arrested for smuggling 1,800 pounds of marijuana; a small plane load from Mexico... Getting arrested was God's sovereign hand of mercy. The slamming jail cell door causes you to think about life! Thank God for being born in America where I had heard "somewhere" **that Jesus was The Way**, etc... Out on bond, I was in my hotel room, at the "end of my rope", where I dropped to my knees just hours before going to federal court. I told God that I was going the wrong way and I had heard that Jesus was "The Way", and I asked for His forgiveness....



I was unfamiliar with the Bible back then, but I realized the fact that I was a sinner. I didn't truly understand "salvation" or Christian terminology at the time, but I knew that the experience had changed my life. **"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new"** (2 Cor. 5:17)

"LORD, WHAT WILT THOU HAVE ME TO DO..." I told the Federal judge that I was guilty and didn't want to waste the

court's time or money. (Long story...) God was merciful, I was sentenced to 5 years in Federal prison but given a suspended sentence and I was put on probation, etc...

Then the Lord moved us to Georgia where I worked as a carpenter and started attending Tabernacle Baptist. As a babe in Christ I soaked in the discipleship classes for us as well as strong Bible preaching and teaching. Eventually I was ordained a deacon in the church. The Lord blessed us beyond measure! Later, I was building houses, developing a small parcel of land as a contractor and had already built the first "spec"

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The Anchor's Hold on Us

A ship holds its anchor securely by its chain cable, but at the same time, the most important thing is that the anchor keeps its own hold on the ship. Because it has dug into the ground on the sea bottom, it holds the vessel hard and fast. Dear friend, do you know anything about your hope holding you? It will hold you if it is a good hope. You will not be able to get away from it. Instead, when you are under temptation or when your spirit is depressed, when you are under trial and affliction, **you will not only hold to your hope, which is your duty, but your hope will hold you, which is your privilege!**

When the Devil tempts you to say, **"I give up,"** an unseen power will reply out of the infinite deeps, **"But I will not give you up. I have a hold on you, and nothing will separate us."** Our security depends far more on God power over us and it is far more than equal to all the efforts of the world, the flesh, and the Devil to drag us away.

How does our divine anchor hold so firmly? **"Which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which entereth into that within the veil"** (Hebrews 6:19). Our hope in God, is that He will ful-

fill His promise and oath, knowing He has a mighty steadfast hold! It is sure regarding its own nature. **The Gospel is no cunningly devised fable.** God has spoken it - It is a mass of facts - It is pure, unqualified truth, and the



great seal of God Himself has been set upon it.

Then, too, this anchor is steadfast; it never moves from where it is lodged. It is sure in its nature and steadfast when in use, and therefore it is safe for practical application. If you have believed in Christ for eternal life and are expecting God to be as good as His word, have you not found that your hope sustains you and maintains you in your position of faith?

My friend, the result of using this anchor will be very comfortable to you. It will not prevent you from being tossed about, for a

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Oh Really, What About You?

It amazes me how quickly we can see the faults and short comings of others... **However, it is a difficult task for a person to STOP, and take a good look at himself or herself.** Let me ask you kindly to look deeply into the mirror of your soul and evaluate your own life!

Seldom do men recognize that we are all just human. Man at his very best is still a sinful, selfish creature...

It seems that every man is born with the heart of a judge! We all have an opinion about the situations and conditions of life around us. This can be a good thing if it is controlled with the right spirit. The Bible says, **"He that is spiritual, judgeth all things"** (1 Cor. 2:15). This is referring to our responsibility to discern between good and evil; what pleases God and what displeases Him according to His Holy Word.

However, the Lord Jesus told us **"Judge not, that ye be not judged"** (Matt. 7:1). In

that portion of Scripture the He was speaking primarily about the subject of SELF EXAMINATION. In other words, don't look at the splinter that is in your neighbors eye when you haven't first removed the beam out of your own eye. Our tendency is to ignore our own faults. Our inclination is to be concerned about the affairs of others when in fact it is none of our business.

In the last chapter of John's gospel, we find our resurrected Lord Jesus walking with the Apostle Peter and the Apostle John. Peter could not help himself as he saw the beloved John with Jesus and so he asked Christ, **"Lord, and what shall this man do?"** (John 21:21) **That seems to be the typical attitude of all** as we concern ourselves with the personal affairs of our friends. (What is my neighbor doing or not doing?) But Jesus rebuked Peter and told him that the will of God for John was not Peter's concern, rather simply for Peter to follow the Lord Jesus!

If we are ever going to see ourselves properly, **as the Lord sees us**, we must stop looking so much at others and concentrate our energy on our own weaknesses. For example, a problem with our temper!

When we get into our car and drive in traffic we find the pressure sometimes overwhelming! Naturally, we like to think of ourselves as "perfect" drivers and everyone else is in our way, and we may cry out... **But losing our temper displeases the Lord Jesus!** It really doesn't matter if I am at fault or it's the other driver, I must remind myself that we are all human. We all make mistakes! We all need patience. We all need forgiveness...

The solution to our dilemma is quite simple!

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ship that is at anchor may rock a good deal and the passengers may become very seasick, but it cannot be driven away from where it is anchored. Its passengers may suffer discomfort but they will not suffer shipwreck. A good hope through grace will not deliver you from inward conflicts altogether. More than that, it will even involve them. It also will not screen you from outward trials. In fact, it will be sure to bring them. However, it will save you from all real peril.

The condition of every believer in Jesus is very similar to that of the landlubber on board ship who, when the sea was rather rough, asked, "Captain, we are in great danger, are we not?" **He received no answer, and so he said, "Captain, don't you see great fear?"** Then the old seaman gruffly replied, "Yes, I see plenty of fear, but not a bit of danger."

It is often that way with us; when the winds are blowing and the storms are raging, there is plenty of fear, but there is no

danger. We may be greatly tossed around, but we are quite safe, for we have an anchor of the soul that is both sure and steadfast and will not move. Think about this. What will you do if you have no anchor? A storm is coming on. I see the threatening clouds and I hear the



strengthening winds of the distant hurricane. What will you do? May the Lord help you to flee for refuge immediately to the hope that is set before you in Christ Jesus. Everyone needs the Lord Jesus Christ to anchor their soul and spirit securely in God's loving care.

Lay Aside Every Weight

Every one of us has weights or hindrances that need to be removed if the influences of God's Word and of His Children are to have their full impact upon us.

Throw off everything that hinders. **This is a positive action. Don't just hope they will fall away,** that you will lose interest and need them no more.

Some of these weights are obviously sinful and harmful, so consciously remove them. The addict must dispose of his stock of drugs, the alcoholic his bottles of liquor, the smoker his unused cigarettes. Only then in those low periods when tempted to go back will he have none to turn to.

Many weights and hindrances can go unrecognized and therefore undisturbed. We consider them

part of us. Many are not only considered harmless but we pretend them to be wholesome and healthy. They are to be identified by asking whether they hinder your walk with the Lord. And that in turn



calls for an assessment of what you have done for the Lord today, this week, this month.

Probably the biggest hindrance is time itself. You fill your time with so much that we wonder how you fit in everything you do, **but do you have time for the Lord?** This ap-

plies especially to regular Bible reading and waiting on God in quiet devotion - listening to His voice and the ministry of the Holy Spirit in your life. Unless you lay aside something you may never hear the Lord speaking to you for you do not give opportunity for Him to speak.

Do YOU BELIEVE IN HELL?"

"And in Hell he lift up his eyes" Luke 16:24.

And since there is a Hell then you need to ask yourself one solemn question, "Is that where I am going to be forever? How can I escape from this horrific place, and its fire which is never quenched?"

FIVE LIES ABOUT HELL

In Luke's Gospel chapter 16, I want you to notice how quickly the Lord Jesus Christ demolished the Devil's lies and man's falsehoods about Hell.

The first great lie and the first great falsehood that the Devil propagates and man accepts is this, **that Hell is what you make of life down here. Hell is in this life.** The Lord Jesus demolished that lie, for He said, "The rich man" verse 22, "also died and was buried, and in Hell he lifted up his eyes..." So Hell is not what you make in this life.

The second lie of the devil and the second falsehood that men embrace is, **"Hell is annihilation". When you die that is it.** I remember hearing a famous politician interviewed about his beliefs, before he passed away, and he said, **"When I die that is the end."**

What a fool he was! When he died he unlearned that lie very speedily in Eternity. God says in His Book, that after death in Hell the rich man lifted up his eyes, being in torments. Hell is not annihilation.

The third lie of the devil and the third falsehood men embrace is, **"Hell is soul-sleep in absolute unconsciousness".** The Lord Jesus Christ destroyed that lie as well, for He shewed the consciousness of the rich man in Hell. He said he was in torments. **He was totally and absolutely conscious.**

The fourth lie of the devil and the fourth falsehood believed by men is, **"Hell is a purgatory that fits the soul for Heaven".** The Lord Jesus disproved that lie. He said that between Heaven and Hell there is a great gulf fixed, and no one ever passed from Hell to Heaven. The unbridgeable gulf between Heaven and Hell! So Hell is not a purgatory from which sin is cleansed from the soul, and the soul is supposedly prepared for Heaven. Rubbish!

The fifth lie of the devil and falsehood believed by man is, **"Hell is a place where departed souls**



can communicate with their loved ones on earth."

In the rising tide of demonism and witchcraft today we are told by so-called spiritualists, that the dead can communicate with the living. If this rich man could have communicated with his living brethren then he would not have asked Abraham to send Lazarus to talk to them.

The Lord disproved those five colossal lies propagated by Satan and accepted by men. Note that those five lies form the basis of all anti-Hell theology and the beliefs of all those who oppose the plain teaching of the Bible about the doctrine of Hell.

What is true of Heaven is true of Hell. **When you have been in Hell ten billion years in the darkness, the torments will have just begun. There is endlessness in Hell. It never ends.**

If we could say to the damned, "After ten million years these doors will open..." then hope would spring eternal even in the breast of the damned. But there is no such thing as this torment having an end!

The saddest road to Hell is to pass by the Word of God. The saddest road to Hell is to close your ears to the warning of the blessed Holy Spirit, your eyes to the Son of God, and pass from the Gospel message to the blackness of darkness forever.

These are my final words to you, and I say to you, as we gaze out into the darkness of Hell, into the loneliness of Hell, into the restlessness of Hell, and into the endlessness of Hell, "Make haste to Calvary, wash in the Saviour's Blood, come this day to the Saviour and in God's Name be in time". **Bow you head now, and call on the name of the Lord Jesus in a word of prayer. Confess your sin to Him and receive Christ as your personal Saviour from Hell!**

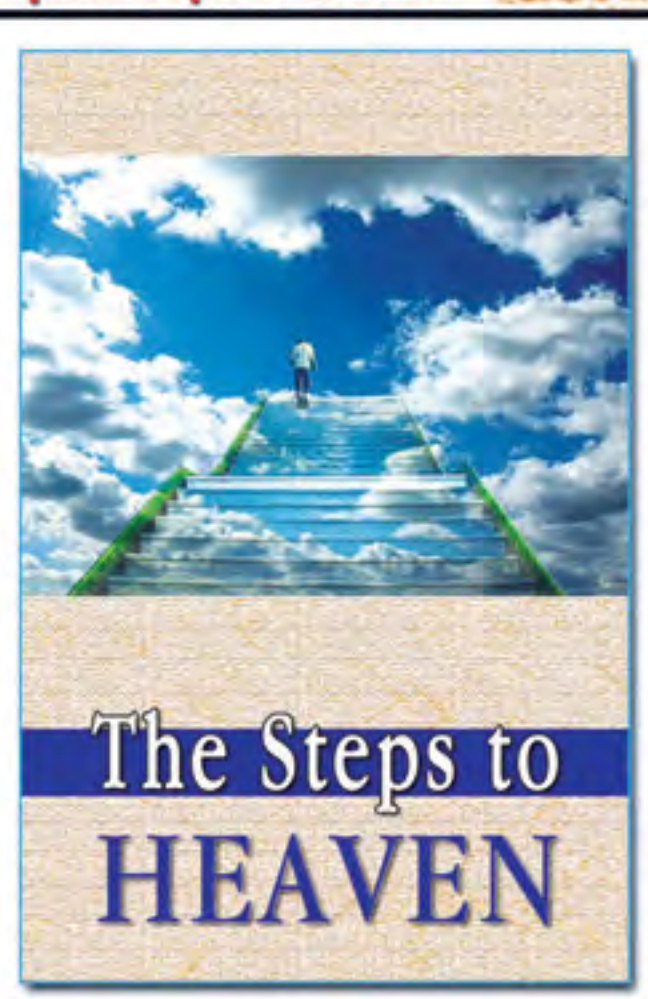
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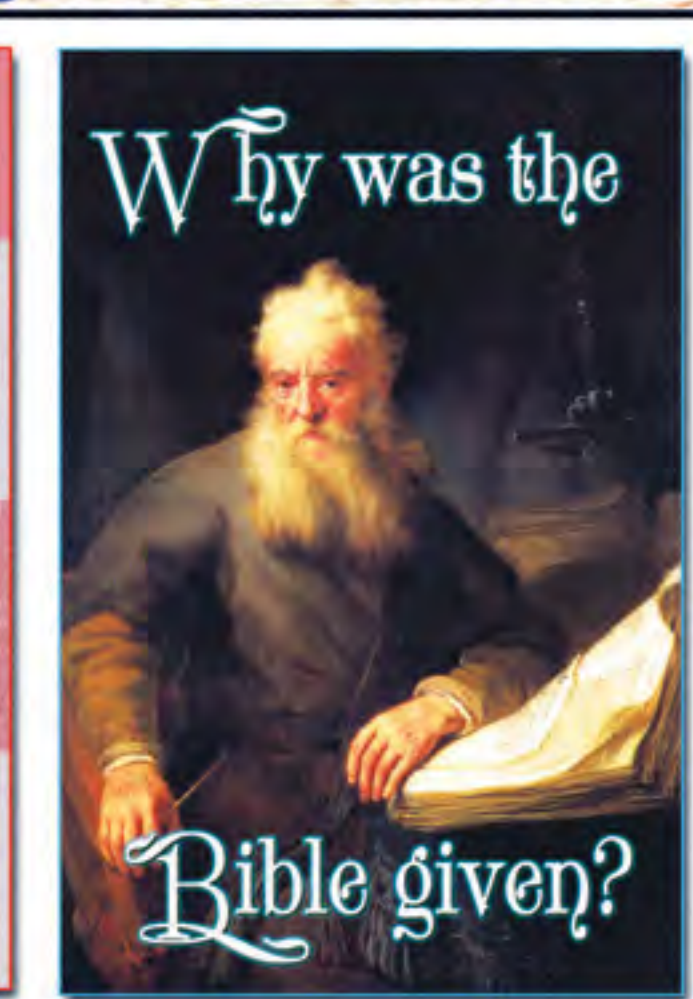

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house with plans to develop more... God had given us eight acres of land, with our own private water fall and large pond. I had just built our 3,200 square foot dream house when the Lord called me into the ministry. Having surrendered my life to



Christ I just wanted to know and do the Lords will. I battled with the concept of God wanting to use someone like me in the ministry. Then the Holy Spirit spoke to my heart when reading, "Then said Jesus to them again, Peace be unto you: as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you" (John 20:21). Peace came within and we forsook all, we abandoned our dreams and building plans to follow Him to North Carolina...

"LORD, WHAT WILT THOU HAVE ME TO DO..." In 1982, I began attending Piedmont Bible College in Winston-Salem. At PBC, I became very intrigued while studying ancient Greece. My mother was Greek and spent her childhood in Greece during WWII. That seed thought inspired me to investigate the Gospel work in Greece and I was astonished. The Orthodox teach religious traditions, not eternal security through trusting Christ... There is no separation of church and State in Greece, and the Greek Orthodox Church did not allow missionaries' visas.

"LORD, WHAT WILT THOU HAVE ME TO DO..." In July of 1985, we left by faith for Greece with \$500 a month pledged support and just seven suit cases for the family (Cheryl, Trish & Matt). I didn't know the language, where we would stay or what we would do, but clung to God's promise, "Faithful is He that calleth you, who also will do it. Brethren, pray for us" (1 Thess. 5:24,25). And God is faithful! In His sovereignty, I met



Bro. George Kantartzis, who became my lifelong friend and co-worker. He published a bi-monthly evangelistic Greek newspaper, "THE WINNERS". Bro Georgie invited me to help him while learning the Greek language. I quickly learned and realized what a great tool the written page was to LEGALLY reach the lost Greek people in an objective way. The response of many letters and calls was encouraging!

"LORD, WHAT WILT THOU HAVE ME TO DO..." After a few years the Lord spoke to my heart about publishing my own evangelistic paper. After much prayer, the Lord provided an old house that had a tobacco barn behind it. I converted the dilapidated barn into a print shop and began our EYATTEAIO-ΦΩΣ publishing ministry, printing an evangelistic newspaper and literature, which we distributed all throughout Greece! At the same time I continued to help Bro Georgie, my dear friend... Everything we publish is given out for free to spread the glorious Gospel of Christ! It is a ministry to reach souls, not a business. God has blessed our feeble efforts through the years with many souls coming to the Lord.

Then in 1999, tragedy struck the Meador family, as my Cheryl was diagnosed with stage three breast cancer and we were told her type of breast cancer was aggressive, her condition was 93% fatal! We did return briefly to the States so she could do her chemotherapy and surgery. While on the chemo, we were in a head on car collision and Cheryl broke her back. Those were some "dark" months, but God was extremely merciful, Cheryl was of the 7%. Thank God the Lord held the cancer and He enabled us to return to Greece, albeit Cheryl walking with a cane.

"LORD, WHAT WILT THOU HAVE ME TO DO..." Cheryl's health was failing... I did not want to move back to America, but the Lord keep speaking to my heart about her various health problems and convinced me through much prayer and fasting. I believe the most important issue for any Christian is the will of GOD and so I was fearful and hesitant to move without God's guidance. But the Lord made it clear, this was His will and He brought us back to the States. This was God's plan, to publish two evangelistic papers, EYATTEAIO-ΦΩΣ still which is in Greek, and also GOSPEL LIGHT. And also now in both languages, Gospel tracts and tri-folds and we send them freely in bulk to Greek Gospel workers in Greece, Australia, Canada, and every State in the U.S.

I'm thankful God allowed us to go to Greece for two decades and yet brought us back, "according to the good pleasure of His will" (Eph. 1:5). And in doing so He increased our Gospel outreach from what it was. And now, a place where we are near great doctors for my dear Cheryl...

Life is short! I don't know what the Lord wants you to do with your life. I hope you know as Romans 12 proclaims, "... THAT YE MAY PROVE what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, WILL OF GOD". What about you? Be honest, have you ever surrendered your life to Christ and asked, "Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do..." Why not go to God in surrendered prayer today!

Science Hopes to Offer Us 1,000-Year Lifespans...

In his book Long for This World, Jonathan Weiner writes about science's promise to radically extend how long we live. At the center of the book is English scientist Aubrey de Grey, who predicts that science will one day offer us 1,000-year lifespans. Aubrey claims that molecular biology has finally placed a cure for aging within our reach.

But what difference does it make if, after living 1,000 years, we will eventually die anyway? Remember, "And all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred sixty and nine years: AND HE DIED" (Gen 5:27).

De Grey's prediction only postpones facing the ultimate question of what happens when we die. It does not answer it.

The Scriptures tell us that death is not the end of our existence. Instead, we are assured that everyone will stand before

Christ—believers for their works and non-believers for their rejection of Him (John 5:25-29; Rev. 20:11-15). All of us are sinners and in need of forgiveness. And only Christ's death on the cross has provided forgiveness for all who believe (Rom. 3:23; 6:23). The Bible says, "It is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment" (Heb. 9:27).

Our appointed face-to-face encounter with God puts everything in perspective. So whether we live 70 years or 1,000, the issue of eternity is the same: "Prepare to meet your God!" (Amos 4:12).

See the birds as they fly through the air, the beasts as they roam the earth, the fishes as they swim in the sea, and then ask, who was it who made them to differ? Was it not their Creator who sovereignly assigned their various locations and environments to them?
