Eternal Life Comes by Good Works, or by Faith?

Man has difficulty in accepting the mercy and loving forgiveness of God, so freely, without trying to «do something» to earn his or her eternal salvation. «... but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord» (Romans 6:23).

However, imagine if a voice came from Heaven proclaiming, "If you will crawl on your knees for ten miles I will save your soul and give you eternal life!" Or perhaps if the voice of God promised that if you do something physical and tangible, like give ten thousand dollars to the Church, or spend a week on your knees praying, and for this God will guarantee you an eternal home in Heaven! I tell you, then multitudes of people would rush out and «DO» these good works to obtain God's favor. You know that's true.

Self-participation, or doing good to earn salvation is an easier concept for many to accept than God's simple plan of salvation - a free gift by faith! Indeed, the Holy Scriptures command us to do good works, but NOT for our salvation. The Bible explains another twofold purpose for trying to be good. First, «...That they (other people) may see your good works, and glorify your Father,



which is in Heaven,» (Matthew 5:16). Our good works are an external evidence of an internal change that has taken place in our hearts and it shows this to others through our born again lives. Unbelievers recognize your changed new life in Christ and this brings glory to God! The Apostle Paul said, «For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's» (1 Corinthians 6:20).

The Bible teaches, Zacchaeus did good works AFTER he was born again, «And Zacchaeus stood, and said unto the Lord; Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have taken any thing from any man by false accusation, I restore him fourfold» (Luke 19:8).

True Biblical salvation will change a person at the precise point in time he/she becomes a Christian. The Apostle Paul received Christ as Saviour on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:6) and his life was transformed on that day. Paul went from persecuting Christians to praising Jesus Christ! Paul's life of good works did not earn him a place

other with our unforgiving attitudes. Let me just say, our churches and families are full of short sided accusers! What we need is a personal mirror to examine ourselves and take time to think spiritually about whoever we're accusing. «He that is without sin among you, let him first cast a stone...»

THE ACCUSED: The point here is that the adulterous woman is guilty! That sounds like you and I

as we are in fact all guilty sinners! So how can any Christian go to pointing the finger and declaring, "That's unforgivable what you did!" **Our Lord is not like that. God will never mention nor remember our sins.** He will never throw them in our face; they are gone forever in the depths of the sea -blotted out as a thick cloud, never to be remembered against us. Thank God, there is NO condemnation to them that are in Christ Jesus. For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, **AND THEIR SINS AND**

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The fool says, "Not today, I will do it TOMORROW."

The wise man sees what ought to be done and does it today. The foolish man says, "I will do it tomorrow." The men who always do the thing that should be done today are successful for time and for eternity. The men who put off until tomorrow what should be done today will fail for time and eternity. «The Holy Ghost saith, Today.» Man, in the folly of his heart, says, "Tomorrow." I don't have time right now.

I have no doubt that thousands of men and women intend to be Christians at some time, but they keep saying: "Not yet, not today." I am going to tell you not merely why you should become a Christian, but why you should become a Christian today.

The sooner you come to Christ, the sooner you will find the wonderful joy, which is found in Him. In Jesus there is an immeasurably better joy than there is in the world, a purer joy, a higher joy, a holier joy, a more satisfying joy in every way.



This fact is not open to dispute: Everyone knows that it is true. Go to any person who has ever tried the world, and then tried Christ, and ask him, "Which joy is better-the joy which you found in the world or the joy which you have found in Christ?" You will get the same answer- every time. The joy found in the world cannot for a moment be compared with the joy that is found in Christ.

Deep And Abiding Peace

The sooner you come to Christ, the sooner you will escape the wretchedness and misery that there is away from Christ. First of all, there is the misery of an accusing conscience. No one out of Christ has peace of mind.

There is slavery in sin. «Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin» (John 8:34). Away from Christ is apprehension of what may happen, fear of disaster, fear of what man may do, and fear of what may lie beyond the

grave. When you come to Christ, you get rid of the fear of man. You have no fear of misfortune, for you are able to say, «All things work together for good to them that love God» (Romans 8:28). You have no fear of death, for what men call death is simply to depart and be with Christ. The moment you accept Christ, you get rid of the accusations of conscience, the slavery of sin, all fear of disaster, and the dread of death.

Why not get rid of it all right now? Suppose you were on the seashore and saw in the distance a wreck of a ship and a man clinging to a piece of wood. Every once in a while the cold waters sweep over him. Suppose you go out in a lifeboat and say to him, "I have come to rescue you. Get into the lifeboat!" Would the man say, «No, I think I can hold on until morning. Come out again in the morning, and I will get into the boat and come ashore.» You would say, «Man, are you mad? Will you stay out here tonight when you can come ashore now?»

Oh, men and women, out on the wreck of life the cold waves break over you with all the wretchedness of an accusing conscience, the

(Hebrews 8: 12).

Only a fool would deny the fact of sin. The evidence of sin is all around us. All one need do is open his eyes and look. We see the results of sin everywhere. Every heartache, every tear, every sorrow, every graveyard, every hospital is a manifestation that "the wages of sin is death."

So when we find that we are offended by someone's behavior, as Christians we are supposed to **FORGIVE THEM**, whatever it may be... **"For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses"** (Matthew 6:14,15). You might say, "But you don't understand what this person did to me, it's just unforgivable!!!" Let me remind you of Peter asking, "...Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, **I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven**" (Matthew 18:21,22).

Imagine if the Lord Jesus had the same attitude when we sin against Him and He turned His back on us because we weren't "perfect". Thank God for His mercy, compassion and love that He not only tolerates our failures but He forgives and forgets them! He chooses to "remember them no more". Can you do that?

THE ADVOCATE: If we read the account in John 8, Jesus Christ became the advocate of the accused and came to her defense, "So when they continued asking Him, He lifted up Himself..." And that's



when He pointed out that her accusers were all sinners as well.

In the same way Jesus comes to my defense and your defense when others become critical and judgmental, **even when rightfully so**, and Christ says, **"He that is without sin among you, let him first cast a stone..."** Jesus says, "the one that is without sin, the one who needs NO forgiveness, let him/her be unforgiving". And we know that shuts

everyone up! For we all have sinned... I tell you, there is too much bitterness in our world today! And bitterness is an internal root that grows into a thorny spirit. Too many people who hold grudges... too many people find themselves now that won't talk to each other, and too many family members who won't communicate. Yet, the Bible tells us: **"And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, FORGIVING ONE ANOTHER, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you"** (Ephesians 4:32).

We find **THE ACQUITTAL**, in our Biblical account of the scribes and Pharisees shaming the adulterous woman. **"When Jesus had lifted up Himself, and saw none but the woman, He said unto her, Woman, where are those thine accusers? hath no man condemned thee?** She said, No man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, **neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more"** (John 8:10,11). That's the thing for us to always remember about our Saviour. Thank God, there is **NO** condemnation to them that are in Christ Jesus. For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, **and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more"** (Hebrews 8: 12).

When were you Born-Again?

I am saying this from my heart. Did you ever stop to think that you have problems to solve which Jesus did not have to solve? Jesus was not a married man. Jesus was not a mother. Jesus did not live in a modern world. Jesus did not transact business in the complex business world in which you and I are living. Jesus Christ never travelled by automobile. I am speaking reverently when I say that you have problems He did not have to solve. So the big question is not what would Jesus do. The big question is this: **"Do I possess Jesus and does Jesus possess me?"** If I possess Him and He possesses me, then under all circumstances in life I will do just what I ought to do. Every relationship will be right. I will be the right kind of father, the right kind of husband, the right kind of wife, the right kind of mother, the right kind of citizen, the right kind of employee, the right kind of man or woman. Every relationship will be right if I am under the control of Jesus Christ.

When were you born again?

Do you remember when you were converted? Some of you know the time and the place. Let me stop just a minute to say that you do not have to know the time and place, but you had better be absolutely sure there was a time and you had better be positively sure there was a place! A man said to me not long ago, "I do not believe in instantaneous conversion." There is no other kind of conversion but instantaneous conversion. You may not know when it happened, but if you are a true "Christian" it did happen. You may not know just the second it took place, but if you are a Christian there was a moment in your life when you stepped out of darkness into light and out of death into life. You may have gradually come up to the line, but there was a moment when you stepped over; and if you did not step over you are still a lost sinner. You are dead in trespasses and sin. You do not have to know just when you were saved, but you had better be dead sure you are saved. You do not have to understand it. That is the



beauty of it. When I came to Jesus Christ I did not know what the words vicarious and substitutional meant. I did not know theological terms. I was an eleven-year-old country boy. All I knew was that God loved me and Jesus died for me and wanted to save me.

I went to Him in prayer, and ever since that time I have been studying the wonders and the glory and the explanation of it. I did not understand it then. You do not have to have much sense to be saved. Did you ever stop to think that you do not have to have much in your head to be a true Christian? **You just have to have a willing heart.** You do not have to understand how food is digested to eat food and get nourishment. You do not have to understand how medicine cures. All you need to do is get the medicine. You do not have to understand everything in the Bible.

I have a lot of things I am going to ask Jesus about when I get to Heaven. There are some marvelous things all through the Bible about which I have wondered and prayed. But there is one thing that is as clear as the light of the clearest noonday, and that is the road to Heaven. That road is well marked. You do not have to miss it. There may be some mysteries connected with the road, but the road itself is clear and definite and you do not have to miss it. **If you want to know how to go to Heaven; -Jesus is the way. Do you want to know how to go to Heaven? If you do, come to Jesus and trust Him - that is all.** Do you want to know how to be saved? Look to Jesus to save you - that is all.

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in Heaven. His BELIEVING IN JESUS CHRIST when he kneeled in prayer secured his future in Heaven above.

A person must realize that he can never save himself by being good, nor by following any religious practice. Rather, he must be born again of the Spirit, at that point in time when he bows his head and heart to God Almighty and calls upon the name of the Lord Jesus Christ to be saved. **«For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved»** (Romans 10:14).

Secondly, we must note that although we do not work to receive eternal life, there is another purpose for obeying God's Word in good deeds and work. The Bible teaches that we will earn ETERNAL REWARDS based upon our faithfulness to God's service and His will for our lives. **«And, behold, I come quickly; and My reward is with Me, to give every man according as his work shall be»** (Revelation 22:12). «If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward. If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire» (1 Corinthians 3:14). Notice that you can be saved and go to Heaven with little or no rewards simply by living a selfish life...

Then too, I must warn you that you can do GOOD WORKS AND NOT GO TO HEAVEN! «Many will say to Me IN THAT DAY, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Thy name? and in Thy name have cast out devils? and in Thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto

them, I NEVER KNEW YOU: depart from Me, ye that work iniquity» (Matthew 7: 22,23).

«IN THAT DAY...»; This means judgment Day, The Great White Throne Judgment. At that time when a person hears these words their opportunity to get eternal life shall be forever gone. Then they will realize the horror of being sent to Hell for eternity without any hope. It is sad but true that God will reject MANY because they placed their trust in themselves. Jesus is the way to Heaven. Trusting Christ alone and His work on the Cross for our sin is what He wants. This is our work, that we might believe, and accept His finished work. The last words of Jesus as He was dying were, **«It is Finished!»**

Don't you see that? In spite of your good works, **«I never knew you!»** In spite of your honesty, **«I never knew you!»** In spite of your religious fervency... Although even a religious person, but their good works are called iniquity because the object of their faith is wrongly placed.

Why not come to Jesus Christ our Saviour and trust His finished work on the cross for your salvation now? Build your eternal rewards on the foundation Rock which is Christ! **«For the Son of man shall come in the glory of His Father with His angels; and then He shall reward every man according to his works»** (Matthew 16:27). Put your trust in Jesus Christ today! **«Lord Jesus, please forgive me and come into my heart. I admit that I am a sinner and I could never save myself. Thank you for dying on the cross to pay for my sins. I need You and I am trusting You and You alone for eternal life, my salvation! Save me dear LORD Jesus! Amen!»** — Tom Meador

THE COMFORT OF FAITH.

Think of the comfort of faith. Jesus said, **«Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.»**

We find in Hebrews 4: 16, **«Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.»**

Where you find a flower, you know there must have been a seed. Where you find a river, you know there must have been a spring. Where you find a flame, you know there must have been fire. SINCERLY WRONG!

An anesthesiologist was administering a controlled mixture of oxygen and gas to a patient in a New York hospital. **When one of the tanks was empty, the doctor began using a new one clearly marked «Oxygen.»** Almost immediately the patient died.

The coroner's autopsy revealed carbon dioxide poisoning. Upon investigation, the second tank was found to contain pure carbon dioxide and had been mislabeled. The manufacturer denied any wrongdoing. No one knew how this tragic mistake could have gotten by the inspectors.

Fortunately, such errors are rare. But in the spiritual realm they occur all the time. Regarding salvation, many people will say, **«As long as I'm sincere, I'll come out all right in the end.»** They believe they can get to Heaven by their good works; but no matter how right it may seem, it's «the way of death» (Proverbs 14:12). Jesus said, **«I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me»** (John 14:6).

Don't make the mistake of being sincere but sincerely wrong! You may think that you are safe because you go to church. You may think that you are all right because you are not



a criminal. You may think that all is well with your soul because you are basically a «good» person. I'm sure that you are sincere. Don't make the mistake of being sincere but sincerely wrong! **This doctor was sincerely trying to give his patient oxygen, but he was wrong and it was fatal.**

Look carefully into your heart. If you are not absolutely sure that you belong to Jesus Christ, acknowledge your sin and guilt before God and ask Jesus to save you today. Go to Him in prayer! Only the Lord Jesus Christ can forgive sin and give eternal life!

Herd instinct, following the Herd...

My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. —John 10:27

Near the village of Gevas in eastern Turkey, while shepherds ate their breakfast, one of their sheep jumped off a 45-foot cliff to its death. Then, as the stunned shepherds looked on, the rest of the flock followed.

In all, 1,500 sheep mindlessly stumbled off the cliff. The only good news was that the last 1,000

were cushioned in their fall by the growing woolly pile of those who jumped first. According to The Washington Post, 450 sheep died.

The Bible often refers to human beings as sheep. "Know ye that the LORD He is God: it is He that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture" (Psalm 100:3).

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53:6)



Easily distracted and susceptible to group influence, we would rather follow the crowd than the wisdom of the Shepherd.

I'm glad the Bible also describes sheep in a positive way. Jesus said, "I am the Good Shepherd . . . My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me" (John 10:14,27).

So the big question for us is: Whom are we following? One another? Self-centered shepherds? Or the voice and direction of the Good Shepherd?

Our challenge is to avoid the mistake of the sheep who blindly followed one another over a cliff. We must make it our daily purpose to ask ourselves: Am I listening for the voice of the Good Shepherd? Am I following Him?

The IRONY of the CROSS

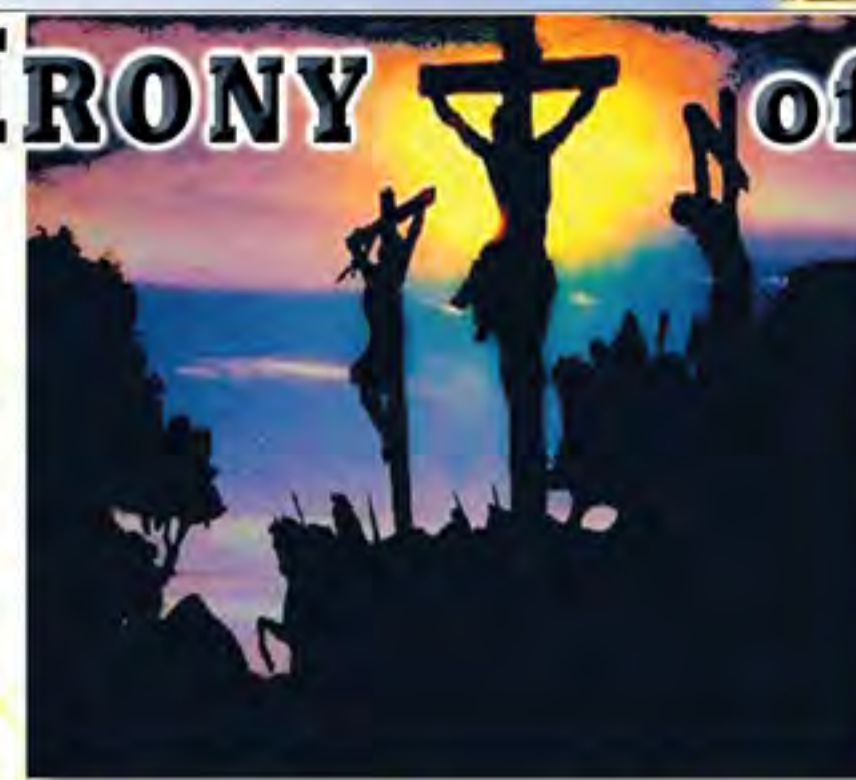
The Cross was not a mistake. It was not a good life falling on bad times. The irony of the Cross is that Christ's Death Demonstrated God's Love!

The great truth of the most familiar verse of the Bible is that the Cross was evidence of God's love. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have everlasting life."

"In the Cross we see God's love at its best and our sin at its worst." God has shown His love for us but at a great cost. In the person of Jesus Christ, God became a member of the human family. He lived His whole life without sin. Then, though He was innocent Himself, He died a terrible death to make our salvation possible. Shining through the darkness that surrounded Calvary that fateful day was the wonderful brilliance of the love of God. Think for a moment about what Christ suffered and remember that it was for us.

Stand in awe as He agonizes before God the Father in Gethsemane until His sweat becomes like great drops of blood falling to the ground.

Follow in horror as He is arrested like a criminal, mutilated by a Roman whip, and



tortured while mocked with a crown of thorns.

Weep for Him as He stumbles under the heavy wooden Cross He is forced to carry

Cringe in revulsion as hardened Roman soldiers pound spikes through His hands, drive nails through His

feet, and roughly drop the beam into place. Listen to Him as He hangs there on the Cross, praying for His enemies, talking lovingly to His mother, and promising salvation to the criminal who repents.

Listen to His cry of abandonment, "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"

Remember that on the Cross, Jesus endured the agony of Hell for you and me. Christ had existed with His Father from all eternity in a relationship closer than anything that we could ever know. Yet the Father "made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Cor. 5:21).

That's what Jesus did for us. In love He became our substitute and died in our place. He overcame our inability to save ourselves by paying the price for our sins. Everlasting life was bought through the substitutionary death of Christ. Won't you receive His love gift of salvation right now? Bow your head now and go to Him in prayer

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
