«For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation...» (Romans 1:16)

What is GOD actually like?

To acknowledge that God exists is one thing, and to acknowledge Him in the general sense that God speaks to us in creation and through the pages of the Bible is another. But we need to know more. What is God actually like?

The Bible gives us many clear and positive answers to this tremendously important question. Here are some of them.

GOD IS PERSONAL. God is not a 'thing', 'power' or 'influence'. He thinks, feels, desires and acts in ways that show Him to be a living, personal Being. But He is not Just 'the man upstairs' or some kind of 'superman'. **"The LORD is the true God, He is the living God, and an everlasting king..."** (Jeremiah 10:10).

GOD IS PLURAL. There is only one true God. He says **"...I am the first, and I am the last; and beside Me there is no God"** (Isaiah 44:6). Yet God has revealed Himself as a 'trinity' of three Persons - the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ) and the Holy Spirit, each of whom is truly, fully and equally God. The Bible speaks of the glory of God the Father; it says that the Word (Jesus Christ) was God; and it speaks of the Lord, who is the Spirit.



While there is only one God, there are three Persons in the Godhead.

GOD IS SPIRITUAL. He has no physical dimensions. He does not have a body, nor does He have any characteristics that can be defined in terms of size and shape. **"God is a Spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth"** (John 4:24). This means that God is invisible. **"No man hath seen God at any time"** (John 1:18). It also means that He is not confined to one place at a time, but is everywhere all the time: **"Do not I fill Heaven and Earth? saith the LORD"** (Jeremiah 23:24). Quite apart

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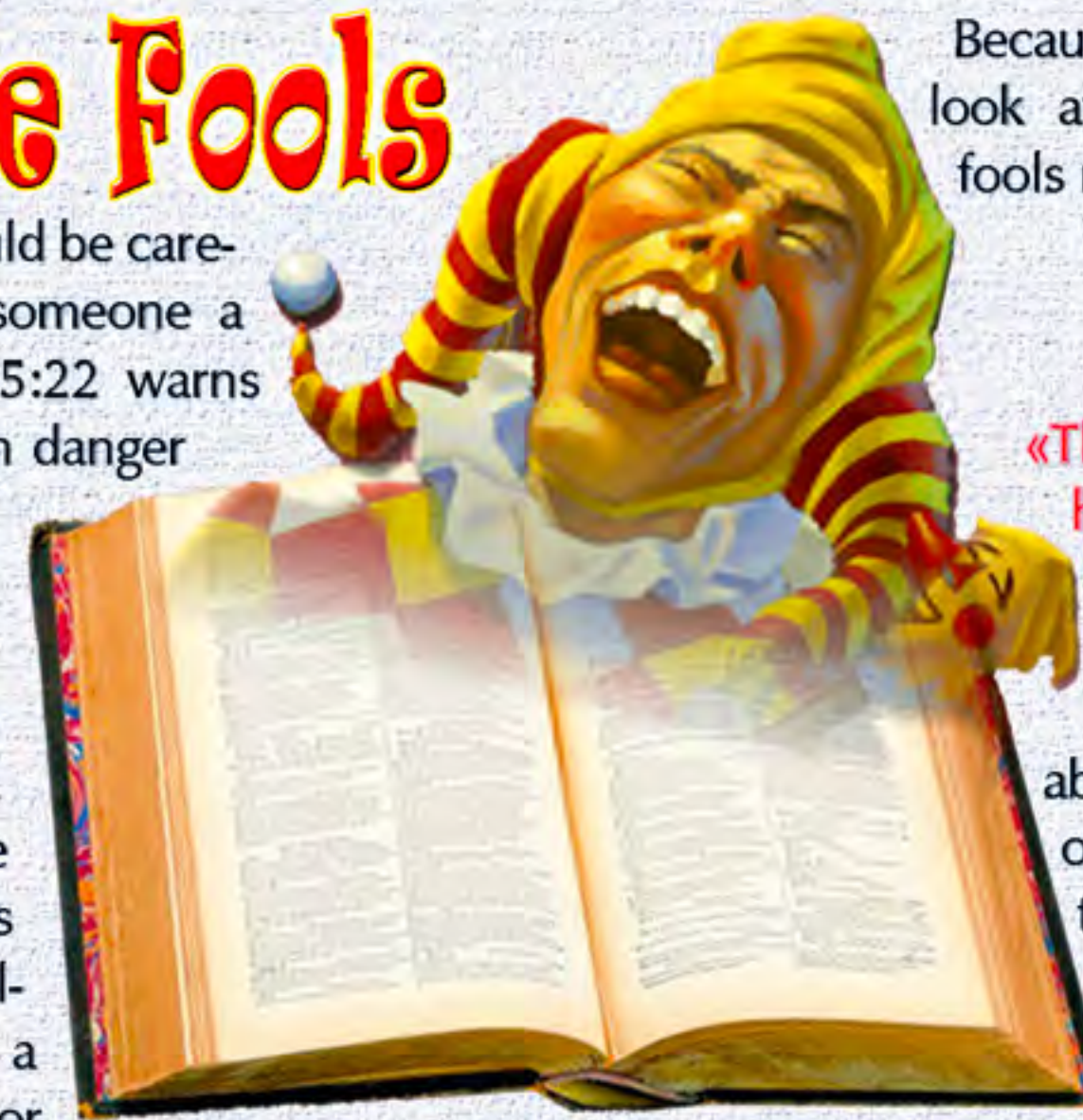
Bible Fools

You and I should be careful not to call someone a fool! Matthew 5:22 warns us that we are in danger if we do this.

There are primarily two definitions for fools in the world. One fool is the person who lacks the mental intelligence to make a proper decision or to have good judgment. This is due to a mental disability...

The second type of fool is a person who has knowledge, but chooses to ignore or disregard God and His principles. This fool has NO FEAR OF GOD! He thinks he can sin against God and safely get away with it.

The Holy Bible is God's inspired Word! It is our AUTHORITY. It is our GUIDE. The Word of God calls some people FOOLS! , God says that some people are foolish...



Because of limited space, let's look at just three categories of fools mentioned in the Bible.

The PHILOSOPHICAL or ATHEISTIC FOOL

«The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God» (Psalm 14:1). Our world around us is full of these fools! Atheists are abounding today as the lies of philosophers erode the truth of the Holy Scriptures.

Students are taught that the **THEORY** of evolution is a fact of science. That is a lie from Satan to deceive mankind! Only a FOOL would believe the **THEORY** of evolution.

This type of atheistic fool says «**in his heart**», there is no God. That little phrase describes the source of the problem. «**The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?**» (Jer. 17:9). In the book of Proverbs we are warned; «**He that trusteth in his own heart is a fool...**» (Prov.28:26).

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Trusting your good life to get to Heaven

When I once asked a lady if she were sure she would go to Heaven when she died, she replied, **"I live a good life."** When I asked a man that same question, he said, **"Well, I'm not too bad."** Both were trusting their good life to get them to Heaven.

Now I am all for good living. One should live as clean, moral, pure and as righteous as he possibly can; but no one goes to Heaven on his own righteousness. The Apostle Paul said concerning his own people,

"For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God" (Romans 10:2,3).

He goes on to say in verse 4, **"For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness**



to everyone that believeth."

Jesus said, **"I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance"** (Mark 2:17). One would be just as safe trusting his sins to get him to Heaven as he would trusting his righteousness. The Bible says in Isaiah 64:6, **"But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags."** **Notice the language of this text, "... all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags."**

God does not accept any of our righteous acts as a hope of Heaven. **HE DIDN'T SAY OUR SINS but our righteousnesses are as filthy rags.**

Suppose a man could turn over a new leaf and never sin again, that he could live righteous until the day he dies. Then would he go to Heaven? Absolutely not! **His righteous living today cannot undo his sinful past.** The truth is, no one is righteous. The Bible says in Romans 3:10, **"As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one."** And verse 23 says, **"All have sinned, and come short of the glory of God."**

The only righteousness that God accepts is His own imputed righteousness. When we trust Jesus Christ as Saviour, God imputes to us, that is, credits to our account, the very righteousness of God. That is what Romans 10:10 says, **"For with the heart man believeth unto**

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Frozen in Time

"But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided?" (Luke 12:20)

On September 12, 1857, off the coast of South Carolina, the S.S. Central America, known as the "Ship of Gold", sank during



a hurricane. Of the 678 persons on board, 425 of them lost their lives. The vessel carried a diverse collection of passengers, from well to do socialites to everyday working class and everything in between. She was on her way from Panama to New York City, but did not make it to her intended destination. The wreckage was discovered in the 1980s lying in a watery grave 7200 feet under the surface and tens of millions of dollars in gold have been salvaged and sold.

There was an auction held last week selling everyday artifacts that have been brought up from this ship. The items are remarkably preserved and were found in luggage, safes and crates where they have lain for over a century. These were objects that

give a picture of everyday life in a bygone era. Everything from paperwork, firearms, clothing, photographs, jewelry, luggage tags, jars and bottles that once belonged to one of the passengers, went home with a new owner. The item that caught the attention of the media was a pair of five button Levi work pants, the oldest extant, which sold for \$114,000.

None of these souls expected to lose their lives and sink into a watery grave that fateful day. Like every one of us they had an appointment to keep; **"And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:"** (Hebrews

9:27). These artifacts that they left behind are a stark reminder that we too will one day leave all of our earthly possessions to be passed to another.

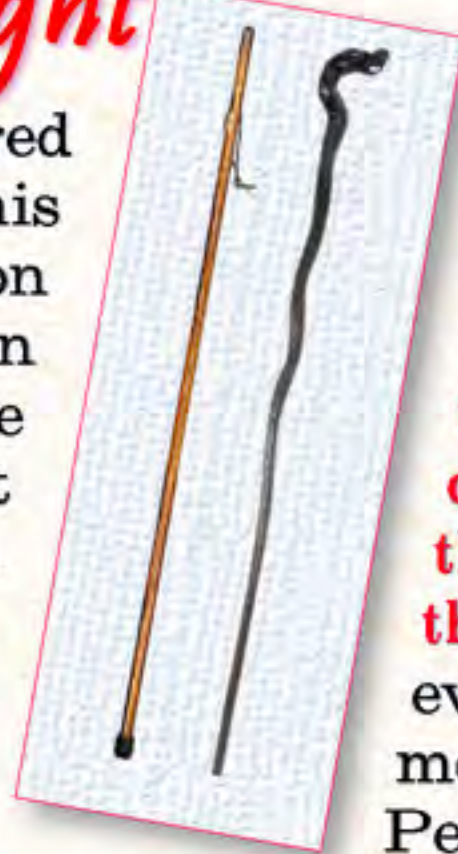
The last words of Queen Elizabeth I were recorded as, **"All my possessions for a moment of time"**.

Whether a prince or a pauper, when it is all said and done, the only thing that will really matter is, what did you do with Jesus? Have you trusted Christ as your Savior? Take your eyes off of the everyday, mundane things which too easily consume our time and look to the Lord. By faith Noah . . . prepared an ark for the saving of his household. Charles Haddon Spurgeon, the great London preacher, found in Noah's life the principle that every act of faith condemns the world. **By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.** (Hebrews 11:7).

Commenting on that verse, Spurgeon said: Live a holy life . . . I have heard it said that **if there is a crooked stick, and you want to show how crooked it is, you need not waste words in description. Place a straight one by the side of it, and the thing is done directly.** Noah con-



demned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.

The New Testament calls Noah a preacher of righteousness. **"...but saved Noah the eighth person, a preacher of righteousness, bringing in the flood upon the world of the ungodly"** (2 Peter 2:5), even though none of his sermons are recorded in the Bible. Perhaps it was Noah's obedience to God in building the ark that stands as his greatest witness to a self-centered and violent generation. **"Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he"** (Genesis 6:22).

How easy it is to be critical of the sins of others. But how much more powerful to demonstrate the grace and righteousness of our God by living for Him.

What is GOD actually like?

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from anything else, this means that God is fully aware of everything that happens everywhere. This includes not only everything you do and say, but every thought that passes through your mind.

GOD IS ETERNAL. God had no beginning. In the Bible's words, **"... even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God"** (Psalms 90:2). There never was a time when God did not exist and there never will be a time when He will not exist. God describes Himself as the One **"...which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty"** (Rev. 1:8). And He remains eternally the same: **"For I am the LORD, I change not..."** (Malachi 3:6). All that God ever was He still is and always will be.

GOD IS INDEPENDENT. Every other living being is dependent on people or things, and ultimately on God - but God is totally independent of His creation. He can survive on His own. God is NOT **"... worshipped with men's hands, as though He needed any thing, seeing He giveth to all life, and breath, and all things"** (Acts 17:25).

GOD IS HOLY. He is majestic in holiness, awesome in glory. There can be no comparison with the holiness of God. There is no one holy like the Lord who is utterly without fault or defect. The Bible says of Him, **"Thou art of purer eyes than to behold evil, and canst not look on iniquity..."** (Habakkuk 1:13). And this holy God demands holiness from every one of us. His command to us today is: Be holy, because I am holy.

GOD IS JUST. The Bible says that the Lord is a God of justice and that righteousness and justice are the foundation of His throne. God is not only our Creator and Sustainer; He is also our judge, rewarding and punishing, in time and eternity, with a justice that is perfect and beyond any appeal or dispute.

GOD IS PERFECT. His knowledge is perfect. **"Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in His sight: but all things are**

naked and opened unto the eyes of Him with whom we have to do" (Hebrews 4:13). God knows everything in the past, present and future, including all our thoughts, words and deeds. His wisdom is perfect and utterly beyond our understanding. **"O the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments, and His ways past finding out!"** (Romans 11:33).

GOD IS SOVEREIGN. He is the sole and supreme ruler of the universe, and nothing whatever is outside of His control. **"Whatsoever the LORD pleased, that did He in heaven, and in earth, in the seas, and all deep places"** (Psalm 135:6). With God there are no accidents or surprises. He writes all the world's history and works out everything in conformity with the purpose of His will. God needs no advice or consent for anything He chooses to do. Nor can anyone prevent Him doing what He pleases: No one can hold back His hand or say to Him: 'What have you done?'

GOD IS OMNIPOTENT. He is all-powerful. In His own words, **"Behold, I am the LORD, the God of all flesh: is there any thing too hard for Me?"** (Jeremiah 32:27). This does not mean that God can do anything, **(God cannot lie, change, make mistakes, sin, or deny Himself)** but that He can do anything He wishes consistent with His character.

These are just brief sketches of some of the things God has revealed in the Bible about His own nature and character. There are other truths about God in the Bible though there are many things about Him we cannot possibly understand. He performs wonders that cannot be fathomed, miracles that cannot be counted. In that sense, the Almighty is beyond our reach and no amount of human intelligence or reasoning can change that. **"Bless the LORD, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless His holy name"** (Psalm 103:1).

Two Great Fears

The Lord, who is sovereign over changing circumstances, **will eventually guide us to our desired haven** (Psalm 107:30).

Bible Fools

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Your heart can deceive you. Emotional feelings come and go influencing our judgments. However, our relationship with God must be based upon objective faith not subjective feelings.

«In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth» (Gen. 1:1). That is a **FACT**, it is not a theory. The Word of God has the true facts whether we believe them or not... God's word is true whether you accept it or reject it. The Bible declared the earth was a round sphere when the **"scientists"** of yester-year insisted it was flat...

Our systematic universe tells the FOOL that there is a God! «The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork» (Psalm 19:1). **So much design and order displayed in the heavens, logically reveals the work of the Designer...**

According to Romans chapter one, God's eternal power and His Godhead are displayed through creation so that mankind is without excuse! The balance of nature, the beauty of His creation proclaim, «**Don't be a fool, there is a God!**»

The SELF-CENTERED or UNPREPARED FOOL

In Luke 12:16-21, we find a parable about a rich man who had too much! He had an

«I» problem... «**And he thought within himself, saying, What shall I do, because I have no room where to bestow my fruits? And he said, This will I do: I will pull down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry.**»

There are twelve personal references to self in this parable. **The problem was, he left God out of his life.** The man focused on "his" possessions, and how to keep them, neglecting to see God as the Sovereign One in control of everything in his daily life... He didn't acknowledge God for the blessings...



Many people make this same mistake. The rich man had a false security in "his" goods being laid up. He thought he could rest, and be happy forever. Notice the Bible says that God calls him a FOOL. «**But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those**

things be, which thou hast provided?» (Luke 12:20). This is everyone's problem who neglects God! We must acknowledge the Lord, and seek His will in our lives. Only a fool does not prepare to die. Only a fool believes he can avoid facing his Maker one day. «**And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment**» (Heb. 9:27).

The DISOBEDIENT or REBELLIOUS FOOL

The greatest sermon ever preached is The Sermon on the Mount, found in Matthew chapters 5 through 7. Here we find the «Beatitudes» for Christian living. The Lord Jesus delivered a new standard of life different from the old Mosaic law. **We are not to take a vengeful «eye for an eye» approach to those who do us evil, but rather «turn the other cheek».** The law states, if you kill someone this is murder, but Christ said, «**That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment**» (Matt.5:22). The law says, premarital or extramarital sex is adultery. But God says, «**That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart**» (vs.28).

This beautiful sermon describing the true Christian perspective of life takes three chapters in the Bible. In chapter 7 the doctrine of salvation is taught, and we are told that «**...Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but**

he that doeth the will of my Father which is in Heaven» (7:21). At the conclusion of the Lord's message He categorizes His listeners into two groups, the wise and the foolish. «**Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of Mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock**» (Matthew 7:24).

«**And every one that heareth these sayings of Mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a FOOLISH MAN, which built his house upon the sand**» (vs.26). Many people have heard the Word of God, but stubbornly rebel in their disobedience to the Lord!

Dear friend, I urge you today, don't be foolish, be wise. **Be wise and call upon the Lord in prayer today, and receive the Holy Spirit into your heart!** If you are not saved, building your eternal house on the Rock, which is Christ, then you are on sinking sand...

The wisest man that ever lived was Solomon. At the very end of his wealthy and full life, having had everything this world has to offer, he said, «**Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man**» (Eccl.12:13). Call on Jesus today, right now! «**For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved**» (Romans 10:14). Receive His mercy, His gift of eternal life... — Tom Meador

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righteousness. The moment we trust Jesus Christ as Savior, **God accounts us righteous in His sight.** Understand that, digest that Biblical truth!

Romans 4:5 promises, «**But to him that worketh not, but believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness.**» The Scripture says in Romans 4:3, «**Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness.**»

One who is trusting in his good life or his own righteousness to be saved has a false hope of Heaven. «Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost» (Titus 3:15). SINCERLY WRONG!

An anesthesiologist was administering a controlled mixture of oxygen and gas to a patient in a New York hospital. **When one of the tanks was empty, the doctor began using a new one clearly marked «Oxygen».** Almost immediately the patient died.

The coroner's autopsy revealed carbon dioxide poisoning. Upon investigation, the second tank was found to contain pure carbon dioxide and had been mislabeled. The manufacturer denied any wrongdoing. No one knew how this tragic mistake could have gotten by the inspectors.

Fortunately, such errors are rare. But in the spiritual realm they occur all the time. Regarding salvation, many people will say, «**As long as I'm sincere, I'll come out all right in the end**». They believe they can get to Heaven by their good works; but no matter how right it may seem, it's «the way of death» (Proverbs 14:12). Jesus said, «**I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me**» (John 14:6).

Don't make the mistake of being sincere but sincerely wrong! You may



think that you are safe because you go to church. You may think that you are all right because you are not a criminal. You may think that all is well with your soul because you are basically a «good» person. I'm sure that you are sincere. Don't make the mistake of being sincere but sincerely wrong! **This doctor was sincerely trying to give his patient oxygen, but he was wrong and it was fatal.**

Look carefully into your heart. If you are not absolutely sure that you belong to Jesus Christ, acknowledge your sin and guilt before God and ask Jesus to save you today. Go to Him in prayer! Only the Lord Jesus Christ can forgive sin and give eternal life! — Ray Barber



Does God forgive where there's no repentance?

Salvation is by God's sovereign grace! But what about when born again believers offend others and need forgiveness?

"Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Here we see a lovely exemplification of His own teaching. In the Sermon on the Mount our Lord taught His disciples "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you and persecute you" (Matthew 5:44). Above all others, Christ practiced what He preached. Grace and truth came by Jesus Christ. He not only taught the truth but was Himself the truth incarnate. He said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life" (John 14:6).

Notice Christ did not personally forgive His enemies. So in Matthew 5:44, He did not exhort His disciples to forgive their enemies, but He does exhort them to "pray for them." But are we not to forgive those who wrong us? This leads us to a point concerning which there is much need for instruction today.

Does Scripture teach that under all circumstances we must always forgive? I answer emphatically, it does not. The Word of God says, "If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him. And if he trespass against thee seven times a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee saying, I repent; thou shalt forgive him" (Luk 17:3-4). Here we are plainly taught that a condition must be met by the offender before we may pronounce forgiveness. The one who has wronged us must first "repent," that is, judge himself for his wrong and give evidence of his sorrow over it.

But suppose the offender does not repent? Then I am not to forgive him. But let there be no misunderstanding of our meaning



here. Even though the one who has wronged me does not repent, nevertheless, I must not harbor ill-feelings against him. There must be no hatred or malice cherished in the heart. Yet, on the other hand, I must not treat the offender as if he had done no wrong. That would be to condone the offense, and therefore I should fail to uphold the requirements of righteousness, and this the believer is ever to do.

Does God ever forgive where there is no repentance? No, for Scripture declares, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1John 1:9). One thing more. If one has injured me and has not repented, while I cannot forgive him and treat him as though he had not offended, nevertheless, not only must I hold no malice in my heart against him, but I must also pray for him. Here is the value of Christ's perfect example. If we cannot forgive, we can pray for God to forgive him. "Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."
