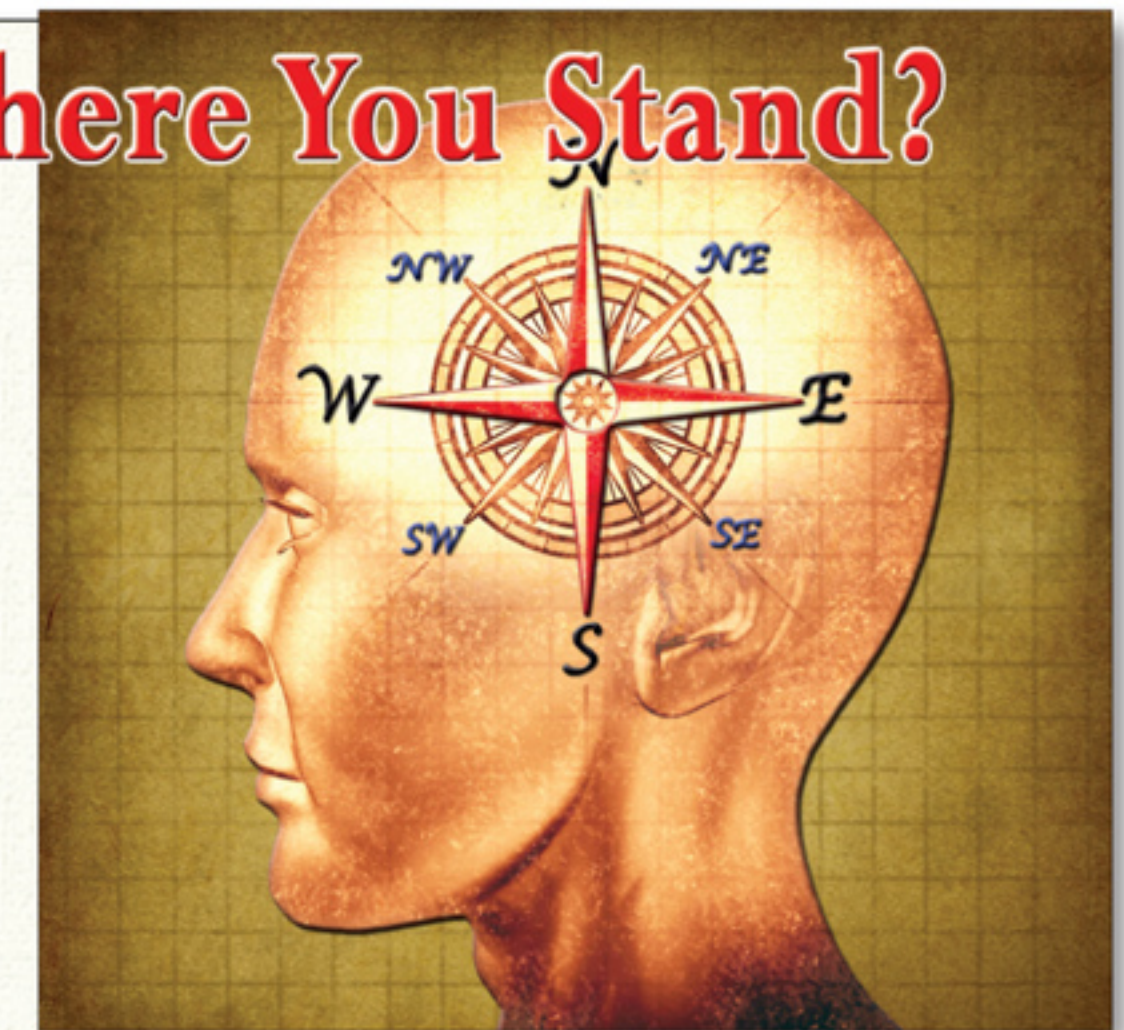
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Do You Know Where You Stand?

He may think his heart is sound when it is defective. But he wants to know it, because then he will not subject it to the strain that he otherwise would. Many lie in a premature grave that might be doing good work now on earth simply because they were not willing to find out what their real condition was, where they stand

Every man at sea wishes to know where his vessel is, its exact latitude and longitude when crossing the Atlantic Ocean some years ago, we sailed for days beneath clouds and through fogs. We were unable to take an observation by the sun and had been sailing blindly. One night I happened to be on deck, when suddenly there was a rift in the clouds, and the North Star appeared. Word was sent below, and the captain of the vessel hurried on deck. I remember how he nearly



laid across the compass as he carefully took an observation by the North Star, that he might know exactly where we were.

We are all sailing across a perilous sea toward an eternal port. Every truly intelligent man and woman should desire to know just where they are, their exact spiritual longitude and their exact spiritual latitude.

How To Evaluate The Question

Let us consider this weighty question of where we are. We should consider it seriously. It is not a question to trifle with. It is amazing that men and women may be sensible about everything else and would not think of ignoring the great fi-

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WHAT IS YOUR LIFE?



«Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away» (James 4, 14).

In the first part of verse 14 we read, "We know not what may be on the morrow." This pronouncement clearly states that the events of tomorrow are unknown to any man. Some naive persons resort to "fortune tellers" as they seek to see into tomorrow. Such so-called "fortune tellers" actually do NOT know

what tomorrow may bring. In our day some resort to mystics and spiritualists who claim to be able to communicate with the unseen world. According to the text we must classify them as frauds, too.

To me, not to know all that may be on tomorrow is a blessing from the Lord. In the future there could well be some heart-ache. If so, I had rather not know. Can you imagine the daily dread and horror if we knew all the valley experiences and heart-ache of the future? It is an act of mercy and grace that tomorrow is not known.

On a Monday in 1951, I loaded my automobile to go away for a meeting in High Point, NC. On this trip my son wanted to go with me. So, we said goodbye to my wife and two daughters about noon-time and made the trip to High Point. I spoke on Monday night and Tuesday night and then Wednesday night. After the Wednesday night service I received a phone call from home that plunged me into the deepest valley of my life, a valley

from which one never completely emerges. A drinking driver had plowed into the rear of my wife's automobile, killing my oldest daughter and seriously injuring my wife. I cannot place in words the grief of my soul as I drove back home with my son.

No one could fully understand the heart ache of such an experience unless he has experienced it himself. My very soul was broken upon an anvil of sorrow into a thousand pieces. Now, had I known this would happen to my family on Wednesday night; I would have canceled the meeting and remained at home to seek to protect my family. I did not know. No one else knows what may be on tomorrow. If we knew all that tomorrow will bring, it would make life a living horror.

These valleys may come, but it is better not to know. It is better to walk by faith and rely upon the grace of God when your pathway crosses into the vale of tears. I have learned, as have many others, that God is able to help in the time of need.

Now, consider the second sentence in

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Is Jesus Coming Back Soon?

“...As the days of Noah were so shall also the coming of the Son of man be” (Matthew 24:37).

Many years ago I came home and discovered that a thief had broken into my house and took some of our possessions. I had no idea this was going to happen. I had no warning. I was unprepared, and we did not have any insurance to pay for our losses...

“But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up. Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh” (Matt. 24:43,44).

The Wickedness

In the days of Noah, “GOD saw that the WICKEDNESS of man was great in the earth...” (Genesis 6:5). The Bible says that people’s hearts were full of evil thoughts continuously, and describes a world of ungodly people, living wild and selfish life-styles... “The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence” (vs.11).

This sounds like our world today! People plan time for entertainment, recreation, sports, movies, sexual relationships and anything else for personal pleasure, but no time for God! Anything and everything, but God... Our society has redefined the moral code of ethics for this generation. The increase in drug addiction and violent deaths are growing at alarming rates. Although the immorality problem is ignored by most people, the Lord Jesus Christ still says it is evil!

Today, with modern technology people spend time watching TV and going to cinemas where you can view criminal sex and violence presented as if it is acceptable behavior.

What about God? Who has time for God? Are you influenced by the Holy Spirit or are you guided by the ways of the world from those around you? “Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world” (1 John 2:15-16).

The Warning

Jesus has warned you and I that the social atmosphere of His 2nd coming will be as it was

in Noah’s day. “...As the days of Noah were so shall also the coming of the Son of man be” (Matthew 24:37). “Behold I stand at the door and knock”

(Rev. 3:20)

What kind of a Christ is this who stands at the hearts door of lost people and knocks? First, the one who stands at your hearts door, is a FAITHFUL CHRIST. And how I thank God for the glorious fact that He is faithful and that He is always there. Supposing that He had not been faithful in standing at my hearts door with His loving knock. I might not have been saved. But, thank God, when I opened my hearts door, there was the faithful Son of God ready to come in, and He did. Friends may prove to be untrue, and a loved one unfaithful, but the Christ who stands at your hearts door is always faithful!

In the second place, please notice that He is a PATIENT CHRIST. We read in God’s word that, “The Lord is not slack concerning his promises, as some men count slackness; but is LONGSUFFERING to USWARD, not willing that any should perish, but that ALL should come to repentance” (2 Peter 3:9). Truly, how longsuffering and patient He is toward those who are unsaved. Do you realize that were it not for the patience of the One who stands at your hearts door, He would have long ago left you. If one of your neighbors were to come to your home and knock on your door and you would refuse to let that neighbor in as you have the Son of God, you would lose a friend. But not so with Jesus, Yes, time and time again He comes to your hearts door and patiently knocks.

Yes, to many poor vile, wretched sinners, we are sometimes tempted not to show our love, but not so with Jesus. 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nancial questions or great social problems of the day. **But they treat this crucial question of eternity as a joke.**

One evening I bought a newspaper from a young man on the street. As he handed me my change, I asked him, **“Young man, are you going to Heaven?”** He acted like it was a joke. I was not surprised at his attitude. That is what you might expect of a poor, uneducated man on the street. But it is not what you would expect of educated, thinking men and women when you come to these great eternal matters of God, eternity, salvation, Heaven, and Hell!



Anyone who makes light of questions like these is a fool! I don't care about your culture, your social position, or your reputation. Unless you face the great question of your spiritual condition with the most profound earnestness and seriousness, you are playing the part of a fool. **Where do you stand?**

We should consider this question honestly. Many people today try to deceive themselves, others, and even God. They know in their innermost hearts that they are wrong, but they try to persuade themselves, others, and God that they are right.

You cannot deceive God. It will do you no good to deceive anybody else, and it is the height of folly to deceive yourself. The biggest fool on earth is the man who fools himself. Be honest! If you are lost, admit it; if you are on the road to Hell, acknowledge it; if you are not a born again believer, say so. If you are an enemy of God, face the facts. If you are a child of the devil, realize it. Be honest with yourself, honest with your fellowmen, and honest with God.

We should consider the question thoroughly. Many people are honest and serious to a certain point, but they don't go to the bottom of things. They are superficial. They give these tremendous

questions a few moments' thought, and then their weak minds grow weary. They say, "I guess I am all right; I will take my chances; I think I'm as good as anybody else!"

No one can afford to guess on questions like these. We must be absolutely certain. It will not satisfy me to hope I am saved; I must know that I am saved. It will not satisfy me to hope I am a child of God; I must know that I am a child of God. It will not satisfy me to hope that I am bound for Heaven; I must know that I am bound for Heaven. Do not lay these questions down until you have gone to the bottom of them and know for certain just where you stand. **“He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life. These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God”** (1 John 5:12,13).

We should consider these questions prayerfully. God tells us in His Word, and we know from experience, that **“the heart is deceitful above all things and desperately wicked”** (Jeremiah 17:9). There is nothing that the human heart is as deceitful about as our moral and spiritual condition. Every man and woman is by nature sharp-sighted to the faults of others and blind to their own faults. We need to face this question in prayer. **You will never know where you stand until God shows you.**

We must pray like David, “Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: And see if there be any wicked way in me” (Psalm 139:23-24). Only when God sheds the light of His Holy Spirit into our hearts and shows us ourselves as He sees us will we ever know ourselves as we truly are. To see ourselves in the light of God's presence, as God sees us, will only be in answer to definite and earnest prayer.

Motions of Worship

"And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life". John 3:14, 15



After the nation of Israel had been out of Egypt for about 38 years, and were getting ready to enter Canaan, they committed a terrible sin. They rebelled against God, and accused the Lord of planning to destroy them by hunger in the wilderness. They falsely said, "there is no water," and; "no bread" (Num. 21:5). As a result God sent fiery serpents among them, and "much people of Israel died" (Num. 21:6). When they cried for help, **Moses was ordered to put a serpent of brass on a pole where everybody could see it, and those who looked in faith upon it were healed. It was a picture of Jesus, lifted upon the cross and**

being made a curse for us (John 3: 14). The brazen serpent was only a symbol, a shadow, and a type. In itself it had no healing power, no saving merit, but was only a pointer **TO THE SAVIOUR.**

Israel, however, soon forgot the message of the serpent, and became occupied only with the symbol. Do you know what happened to this serpent? You don't? II Kings 18:4 tells us that 800 years afterward they were still lugging that serpent around with them. They carefully kept it, and burned incense to it, and worshiped

the serpent of BRASS and forgot the ONE to whom it pointed. No doubt they were very zealous in keeping the image of the serpent bright and shining, and free from corrosion; but they did not remember to look to the Living One whom it symbolized. **This is the evil of formal religion: worshiping the symbol, but forgetting the Lord!** Beware of going through the MOTIONS of worship while your heart is not in it. Religious observance, and mere form, can never substitute for spiritual worship of HIM ONLY.

The Mystery of Death

No one really understands the phenomenon of death. No one understands why entropy must always increase, even in physical systems, but scientific observation shows that it does. Why people should die at seventy years of age instead of seven hundred, or why they should die at all, is still as mysterious in our scientific age as it was to the pagans of antiquity. Gerontologists may study the aging process and discourse learnedly about biological clocks and somatic mutations, but they cannot stop the process. Medical researchers may eliminate many of the diseases that lead to death, but they cannot cure the greater disease of death itself.

Mankind's greatest fear is the fear of death; his greatest grief is grief over the death of a loved one. Death is the great enemy, and the cry of the ancient patriarch echoes through the centuries down the valley of the shadow of death: **"If a man die, shall he live again?"** (Job 14:14).

The answers of the pantheistic and pagan religions are as vague as their evolutionary concepts of origins. They may speak of the spirit departing from a dead body into some strange world of spirits, or transmigrating into the body of some future being, or being swallowed up in the all-soul of the cosmos, or evolving into some higher sphere of spiritual awareness, or some other vague concept of immortality. In none of these religions of evolutionary pantheism, however, is there any promise of a resurrection of the body and a continuation of the whole person-spirit, soul, and body-into endless life. They have all rejected the Creator of life and can therefore offer no hope of a real resurrection of physical life-only a shadowy "after-life," or nothing...

Only the creationist religions (Judaism, Islam, Christianity) speak of a resurrection, because only the Creator of life can conquer death. However, both Judaism and Islam fail to discern the all important necessity for God to become one of us and then die in our place if we are ever to be delivered from the bondage of sin and death.

Since only the God of creation can create life, only He can defeat death!

Jesus had, indeed, **"shewed Himself alive after His passion by many infallible proofs, being seen of them forty days, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God"** (Acts 1:3). 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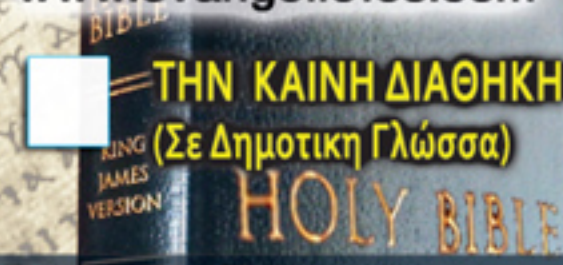
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Salvation Prayer
