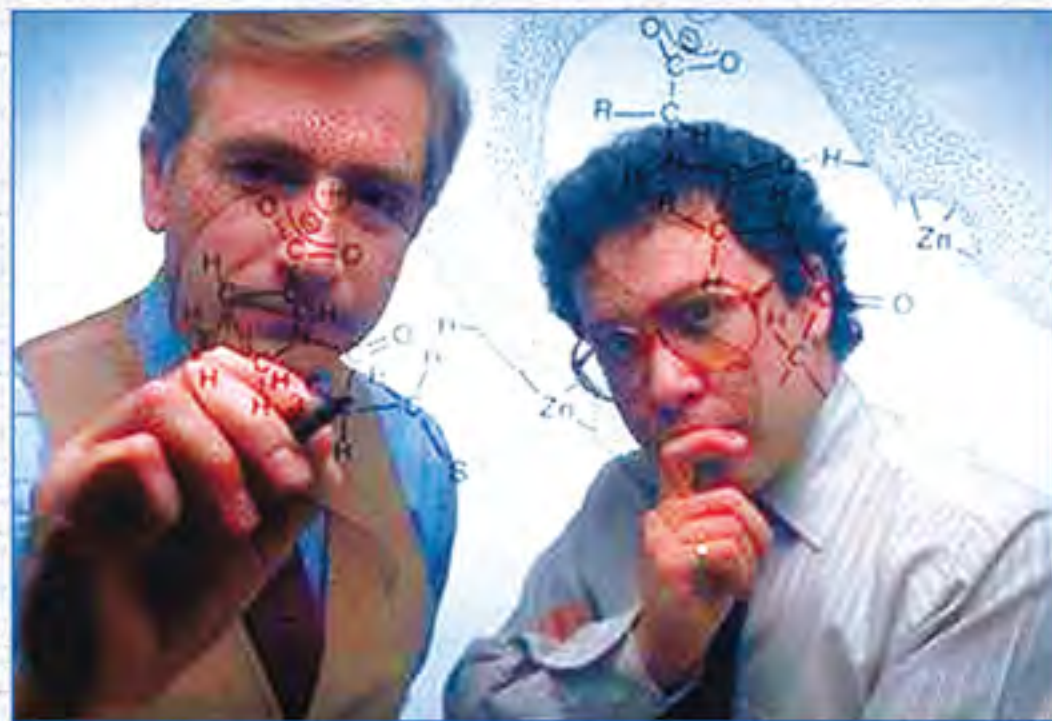

Resting in the Risen Savior...

We're living in perilous times. Life's problems are growing as we journey through this uncertain world of chaos... Christians go to church with their troubles and cares and then often leave, taking their anxieties back home with them...

Some TV and radio preachers falsely proclaim that, "unless you're rejoicing all the time, there is something wrong with you!" Saying, "There must be sin in your life and/or you're not right with God..."

I take them to Calvary, where we see Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane; "Then saith He unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: tarry ye here, and watch with Me. And He went a little further, and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me: nevertheless not as I will, but as Thou



wilt" (Matt. 26:38,39). Notice, Christ was not rejoicing as our sinless Savior was crying in agony, "and His sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground" (Luke 22:44).

Listen, there are times in our lives, when sudden crosses appear and make us cry out in dismay with troubled hearts. You don't need to have a fake smile plastered on your face all day trying to appear that you're "spiritual". Remember, it's not sinful to be exceeding sorrowful, our Lord was! So what should we do with our troubles and trials? The Bible says we should be, "Casting all your care upon Him; for he careth for you" (1 Peter 5:17). "CASTING..." - A DELIBERATE ACT

The word casting is a verb, which implies some action is required. The Lord wants us to decisively take our troubles

"AND GOD IS able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work" (II Cor.9:8).

Immense pressures are upon us all in these eventful days. Sometimes we are forced to exclaim, as Paul did in the first chapter he wrote to the Corinthian church, when he said he was pressed out of measure, above strength, insomuch he despaired of life itself. Individual pressures are upon us all; they relate to our persons, our minds, our bodies, and our inmost souls. They are like the taskmasters of Egypt. They come down with a cruel cutting lash upon us, and we are brought very low in heart, spirit and mind. Then there are family pressures upon us. Anxiety for our homes, anxiety for our offspring, anxiety about their spiritual well-being and their eternity.

And those pressures on parents increase mightily in these days of sin and wicked temptations on every hand. Then there are social pressures upon us; the circumstances, the responsibilities we have in this society of ours. And upon us also are the pressures of our work, the pressures



of our employment, the pressures that bring strain and frustration in our daily work-load and our daily occupation.

The text I have chosen is God's remedy for worry, strain, and pressure. Whether it be family worry, domestic worry, personal worry, or worry about business, or church, or society. What a text it is! I

want to dwell upon this wonderful topic of God. God in His Actuality, for God is real.

The Actuality of GOD

The starting place is, "GOD is"! Knowledge is power. Human knowledge brings human power. Eternal knowledge brings eternal power. The knowledge of the Eternal God brings into our life a power that is greater than all the power that assails us. "Greater is He that is within you than he that is in the world". You can bring all the powers of the world that are pressurizing you and you can put before them the Actuality of God, for God outclasses them all. God is greater than all of them.

God is more powerful than all of them. They are no match for God. God is sufficient and God gives sufficiency to His people.

He is the Ever-Present now: "GOD is". Get this into your heart, believer, get it into your soul, get it into your mind, make it your stay, make it your anchor, make it your creed,

have an abortion. Killing a baby is sin! But today, we have so called "Women's Rights" and irresponsible murders sanctioned by ungodly leaders! Leprosy: A type or symbol of sin.

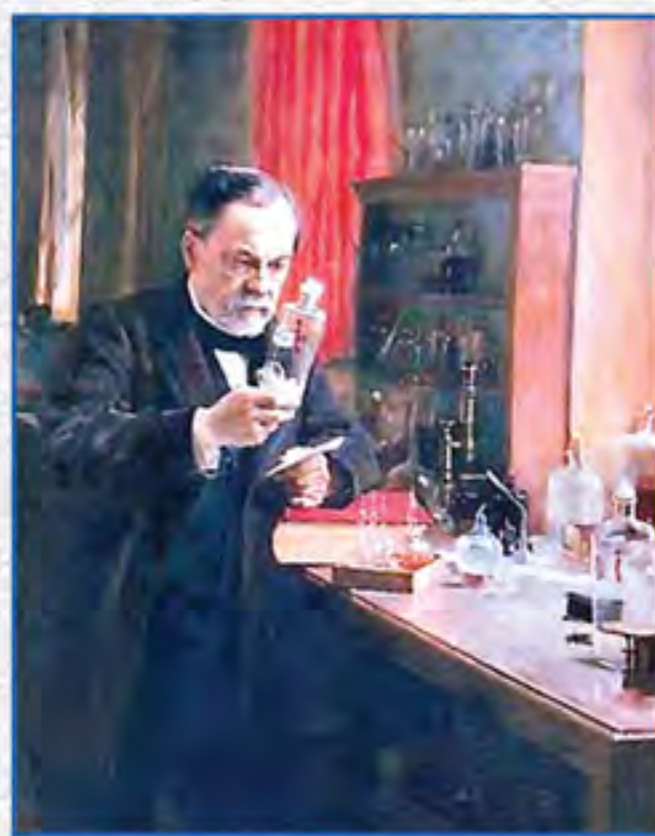
Blindness: A symbol which speaks of

Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, **Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths: But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:** (Matt 5:33,34).

Shortly before his death, the Duke of Burgundy was presiding over the Cabinet Council of France. A proposal was made by the ministers that would violate a treaty but would secure important advantages for the country. Many reasons were offered to justify the deed. The Duke listened in silence, and when all had spoken he closed the conference without giving approval. Placing his hand on a copy of the original agreement, he said with firmness in his voice, "Gentlemen, we have a treaty!"

It's important that Christians act and speak so



that the Savior is glorified. **When you give your word, keep it.** If you make a commitment, honor it. If you take on an obligation, fulfill it. As Jesus said in Matthew 5:37, **"But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil..."**

Instead of making good time their efforts were used to pick up things that were good for nothing but to slow them down. Paul could not believe that they had started **"trash collecting"**. works, lest any man should boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9). They had gotten off track.

Are we guilty of the same thing? Traveling along on our spiritual journey with the Lord do we begin to make **"frequent stops"** just to pick up **"debris"**? Our stops should be just as ordered as our steps. The purpose of both is to bring glory to the Lord, not to collect rubbish. Too many of our acquisitions are worthless, simply **"wood, hay and stubble"**, which will one day be burned up.

Let our doctrines and our dogma be right. Don't hinder your journey or someone else's by frequent stops to pick up debris.

and cares and deposit them with Him. As by faith, we purposely trust God with our problems He will not forsake us. Take time to consider God's omnipotence.

Biblical men trusted God, and He was always faithful to care for them! His eye is on the sparrow, and His eye is on you. His eye was on **Elijah**, and **He sent the ravens to feed him**. His eye was on **David**, even after his sin with Bathsheba and **God took care of him...** His eye was on **Peter** during his denial of Christ, and yet **He kept His hand of blessing upon Peter. His eye is on you in the midst of your troubles and trials!**

We must act, by going to Jesus in prayer and sharing our troubled hearts with Christ. Casting by faith, believing He is able. Then we can truly rest in our risen Savior!

«ALL YOUR CARE» - A DEFINED ANXIETY

As humans, we tend to worry. The Greek word for "care" in our text (*μέριμναν*), means our worries, concerns, and anxieties.... Casting **ALL...**, that's why we find so much instruction in the Bible on trusting Christ with all of our troubles. **"Be careful (Μηδὲν μεριμνᾶτε Don't worry about anything) for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God"** (Phil 4:6).

Cares, worries and anxieties torture us mentally. They distract us spiritually as we mentally replay our fears over and over again, like on a "Memorex" loop tape in our minds. The Devil can torment us **psychologically**

this way. We start to question God...

Like when John the Baptist showed his humanity: After proclaiming that Jesus was the Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world, John asked, **"Art thou He that should come? or look we for another?"** (Luke 7:20). The Lord said, **"Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist"** (Matt. 11:11). We're not greater than John and we too have doubts and concerns that trouble us. So we take ALL of our questions and ALL of our daily cares to Jesus! He loves His children.

«...UPON HIM» - A DIVINE ADVOCATE

Many look to psychiatrists, psychologists and government agencies for relief with their various burdens in life. Now to be sure, these all have their place, but Christ should have the preeminence when we need peace from life's storms.

Your pastor loves you, but don't cast all your cares upon him, cast them upon Jesus Christ! Pastors may help to a point, but Jesus Christ said, **"Come unto Me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest"** (Matt. 11:28). He is God almighty, sovereign over all, and He cares for you. **Our Savior has promised to help us** with our cares, burdens, worries and fears if we will look to Him.

"Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right

hand of my righteousness" (Isa. 41:10).

Listen, don't try to figure out life's problems, you can't. I have my own list of cares, just as you. But anything that happens to you or I in this life has a divine purpose. **"For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory"** (2 Cor. 4:17).

Casting all your care upon who? Who can we go to with our burdens? **"...Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life. And we believe and are sure that Thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God"** (John 6:68,69). Go to our risen Savior in prayer, and ask Him for His help and strength to endure whatever you are facing.

«...FOR HE CARETH FOR YOU» -

A DEFINITE ASSET

Think about **who it is that cares for you!** I'm not speaking about just anybody with a shoulder to cry on. **The Omnipotent One, the One who spoke this world into existence out of nothing.** The One who controls everything in the universe. **The Lord Jesus Christ cares for you!** That's a tremendous benefit Christians possess.

Depression settles in on all of us at some time or another. Between the world, the flesh and the Devil we find ourselves in stormy waters not knowing what to do. But remember, as life's sea tosses you about, **Jesus is with you and He cares.** The disciples thought the Lord was neglecting them when **"there arose a great storm of wind, and the waves beat into the ship, so that it was now full. And He was in the hinder**



part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake Him, and say unto Him, Master, carest thou not that we perish?" Mark 4:37,38).

In faithless desperation we too sometimes cry out, **"Does anybody care?"** The LORD always comes and rebukes the winds and waves in our lives, because **He careth for you!** Family and friends can be wonderful help when needed, but there's no comparison to resting in the risen Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ! Do you know Him?

You cannot have the peace of God until you have made peace with God by receiving Him as your personal Saviour! If you've never done that then bow before Him today in a word of prayer: Confess to God you know you're a sinner. Ask for His forgiveness, thank the Lord for giving His life on the Cross. Trust in His resurrection power to save your soul. And by faith, invite Jesus Christ into your heart and life!
