As we observe and examine the world around us there are many things that seem "unfair" to us. One man asks, "If God is a God of love, why did my wife have to suffer with cancer? She was always trying to do good..." We must be honest and accept that we are limited in our ability to understand the dealings of God with man. "How unsearchable are His judgments, and His ways past finding out! For who hath known the mind of the Lord?" (Romans 11:33,34)

Sometimes God allows suffering **TO GET OUR ATTENTION.** People often turn to the Lord in time of crisis. I know of an atheist who was unconcerned about spiritual matters until he was in a terrible car accident. It was there lying in the hospital bed that he was forced to stop and look up to His Creator. He received Christ as His Savior, through suffering from the trauma.



At times it is **TO DISPLAY HIS GRACE.** The Apostle Paul said, "Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong" (2 Corinthians 12:10). Illness or struggles in life can be used to draw the believer closer to the Lord. In times of trouble we often sense the Lord's comforting hand as He manifests Himself to us during prayerful fellowship!

Then too it is all **part of God's plan TO MAKE US BETTER PEOPLE.** The Lord allows suffering to build character in His children. "And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; And patience, experience; and experience, hope" (Romans 5:3). Adversity builds character.

In William Shakespeare's Romeo And Juliet this question is asked and reflected upon, "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet." The poet stated a simple truth; the person makes the name, the name does not make the person. As Dr. W. A. Criswell commented on the name change for a group in the SBC who wanted to be referred to



as moderates instead of liberals, "A skunk by any other name still stinks."

A name conjures up a mental response. Let someone utter the name Judas, Cain, Hitler, Charles Manson, or Osama Bin Laden and a picture of evil is seen. The names, in themselves, are not evil but the people who bore them were.

The name of Elvis is synonymous with rock music, as is the name of Mother Teresa with humanitarian work, Billy Graham with world evangelism, and Martin Luther King Jr. with civil rights. The names did not make the people, the people made the names.

There is one name that stands above every other name; the name of Jesus; "Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at

the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:9-11). The very name is of great importance and explains much about

Many days have come and gone, but **THIS DAY** is a unique day. Yesterday is gone and tomorrow has not yet arrived. Too often we become anxious over fu-

ture concerns... Thank God for **THIS DAY!** James said, don't talk about what you're going to buy or sell tomorrow, "Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away" (James 4:14).

The Lord Jesus taught His disciples to pray, "Give us **THIS DAY** our daily bread" Matt. 6:11). Why? Because He was instructing them in an Old Testament principle of looking to God and trusting Him for daily sustenance. Just as the children of Israel looked for the daily manna from Heaven, we can look to our Father in Heaven **This Day** to provide for us.

Take comfort in knowing this is a **SOVEREIGN DAY!** "This is the day which the LORD hath made..." Acknowledge this fact, God almighty made the universe with all that it contains, and He made **THIS DAY.** Just as His creation power made the Heavens

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God Provides Through Prayer!

«... Yet ye have not, because ye ask not» (James 4:2). Unfortunately, too often Christians don't believe that their Father in Heaven will supply all of their needs according to His riches in glory. But it is a promise of God, and He cannot lie!

Jesus said when you pray, ask for daily provision; «Give us this day our daily bread» (Matthew 6:11). This is a divine principle in the Bible. In the Old Testament, although God's people were wandering in the wilderness without out food, they were provided with Manna from Heaven by God every day!



I am reminded of the great man of God, George Müller. He operated an orphanage and never asked any man or woman for anything, He prayed to God for provision. He raised up orphans and all by faith in God through prayer. One morning, all the plates and cups and bowls on the table were empty. There was no food in the cupboard and no money to buy food. The children were standing, waiting for their morning meal, when Müller said, "Children, you know we must be in time for school." Then lifting up his hands he prayed, "Dear Father, we thank Thee for what Thou art going to give us to eat."

There was a knock at the door. The baker stood there, and said, "Mr. Müller, I couldn't sleep last night. Somehow I felt you didn't have bread for breakfast, and the Lord wanted me to send you some. So I got up at 2 a.m. and baked some fresh

bread, and have brought it." What a wonderful provision of God from Prayer!

Müller built five houses for orphaned children, where 10,000 were cared for before his death...

The skeptics ask the question, «...Can God furnish a table in the wilderness?» (Psalm 78:19). I tell you, HE CAN and HE WILL PROVIDE for His children. "Jehova Jireh" will see to it!

Sadly, many Christian believers miss out on seeing Christ manifest Himself through His sovereign hand of provision. They have to work it out themselves. A simple lack of faith in God's provision for His own...

They create projects that need funds for the Lord's work and burden others with their well intentioned projects. I believe that our Lord will always provide for whatever He plans! No need to beg... And if He doesn't supply, perhaps it wasn't His will to begin with, rather the will of the project maker.

Every good idea and well meaning intention is not necessarily ordained by the Lord. "Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content. I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need" (Philippians 4:11,12).

We must always remember, without Christ we can do nothing! Without His provision there would be no food, you would have no strength, no health, no job, no anything. «For by Him were all things created, that are in Heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by Him, and for Him» (Colossians 1:16). Have you been Changed?

As people continue to age they go through various experiences that tend to affect their outlook on life. We often hear jokes about men and women going through "the Change" when they reach middle age. One typical example is of a man buying a sports car in an attempt to feel young when approaching old age. Unfortunately, this is a time when according to statistics, men are more prone to having affairs and running off with younger women...

The change of life that all folks need is found in II Corinthians 5:17; "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new".

All across the globe we have multitudes that refer to themselves as Christians. They belong to a church or a religious belief system that convinces them of their claim. But the Bible teaches us that true, born-again believing Christians have experienced a life transforming change at that specific point in time when they received Christ as their personal Savior.

Please note in our text, "if any man be in Christ, he is a NEW creature: old things are passed away; behold ALL things are become NEW". This new creature in Christ now has a new life in Christ. Actually, the phrase, "are become NEW" is literally, "are become new and continue becoming new". In the Greek text it is a continuous action verb and implies an ongoing process. As God works on us, He keeps on conforming us into the image of His Son.

When Christ spoke with Nicodemus he addressed this issue head on. Here we have a man like many men in churches today. He was a good man, a faithful man and a religious man. But all of these attributes were merely external. Jesus said, "Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again" (John 3:7). Something was missing! He was lacking the new-birth. He was missing the life changing experience of receiving Christ. "...Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27).

We should be concerned about those calling themselves "Christians" who have never displayed a personal change in their life. Whether a minor or drastic transformation, depending on the individual; there should be some evidence of a new creature in Christ. The Apostle Paul, another religious man, a zealous leader trying to serve God His own way, was changed dramatically on the road to Damascus. There he met the Master and

cried out, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" (Acts 9:6).

Have you ever knelt before the Lord with a repentant heart and prayed to Him with such submission? Saul the persecutor became Paul the preacher. Old things were passed away and behold all things were become new! His life was changed.

We find Zacchaeus the rich man who climbed the sycamore tree to see Jesus and was gloriously converted! His selfish heart was changed and he said, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have taken any thing from any man by false accusation, I restore him fourfold" (Luke 19:8). And notice, "Jesus said unto him, This day is salvation come..." (Luke 19:9).

When the hearts of men are changed by receiving the indwelling Holy Spirit of God, there is going to be evidence in the form of a "new life". If there is new life there is going to be a hunger for food to exist! You don't have to force or train an infant to hunger

for food, but rather by internal instinct the baby cries out for food and desires to be nursed.

If any man be in Christ, he too should be changed by a new internal hunger to be fed from God's Word. "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby" (I Peter 2:2). "And Jesus answered him, saying, It is written, That man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word of God" (Luke 4:4).

I never went to church growing up and never owned a Bible. I was not interested in religion or the things of God.... I was in my mid twenties when Christ came into my heart back in October of 1976. He changed my life! Having never been to church I did not know the Bible terminology regarding what had happened to me that day on my knees in a hotel room. But I tell you, suddenly from within, as a new born babe in Christ, I yearned for the Word of God! I had to know more about Him....

What was that, that changed me to actually wanting a Bible and wanting to learn about Jesus Christ, my Savior? "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new".

What about you my friend, have you ever been changed? If not why don't you go to Christ today in prayer! "Jesus said,... him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." (John 6:37).

How Can an Infinitely Holy God Forgive Sin?

In order for an infinitely Holy God to forgive the sinner, someone had to pay the debt. Someone had to bear the burden. That is where Jesus comes in. The Bible teaches that God took every sin we ever have committed and ever will commit, and laid those sins on Christ over two thousand years ago at Calvary. Isaiah 53:6 says, "The Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all." Every sin we have ever committed or ever will commit if we live to be a thousand years old, God placed on Christ. The Bible says in 1 Peter 2:24, "Who His own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree ..." First Peter 3:18 says, "For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God ..."

The greatest truth that ever coursed

through my brain is the truth of the substitutionary death of Jesus, that Jesus Christ actually took all my sins, past, present, and future, and bore them in His own body. I told a lady that once. And she said, "I can understand how He died for my past sins, but I cannot understand how He died for my future sins that I have not committed yet."

I smiled and said, "Lady, when Jesus Christ died, all your sins were future. You were not even born."

Friend, God looked down through the telescope of time and saw every sin you would ever commit. Then He put those sins in one big package and laid them on Christ, "The Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

While Jesus was bearing our sins in His own body, God punished Him in our place to pay a debt that we owe, so that when we die we won't have to pay it.

Somebody said, "The Jews killed Christ."

Someone else said, "It was the Roman soldiers." But the Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." According to the Bible, God let Jesus die in our place. He actually punished Jesus in our place so we could escape the punishment. Romans 8:32 says, "He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all..." Don't you see that?

Jesus uttered seven things while hanging on the cross. The sixth utterance was, "IT IS FINISHED." Among other things the statement meant that our sins were completely paid for. — Curtis Hutson

When King David was running for his life from his son Absalom, a man named Shimei cursed him... And David took it! "...Abishai the son of Zeruiah answered and said, Shall not Shimei be put to death for this, because he cursed the LORD's anointed? And David said, What have I to do with you, ye sons of Zeruiah, that ye should THIS DAY be adversaries unto me? shall there any man be put to death THIS DAY in Israel? For do not I know that I am THIS DAY king over Israel? (2 Samuel 19:21,22). David was resting in God's sovereignty!

Perhaps someone is sharp in words towards you. They, look you in the eye and they tell you something that you know is false, just so they can control the matter at hand and shut you up! That's offensive! You want to "verbally" chop their head off and straighten them out! You're well aware of their intent to get rid of you by their erroneous declarations. Let it go! Let them have their way...

Don't lose your temper over some negative circumstance, find grace for THIS DAY. Think about it, remind yourself inwardly as a Christian, "do not I know that I am THIS DAY a child of the King!" I hope that you are! We don't need to cut off somebody's head because they've wrongly offended us.

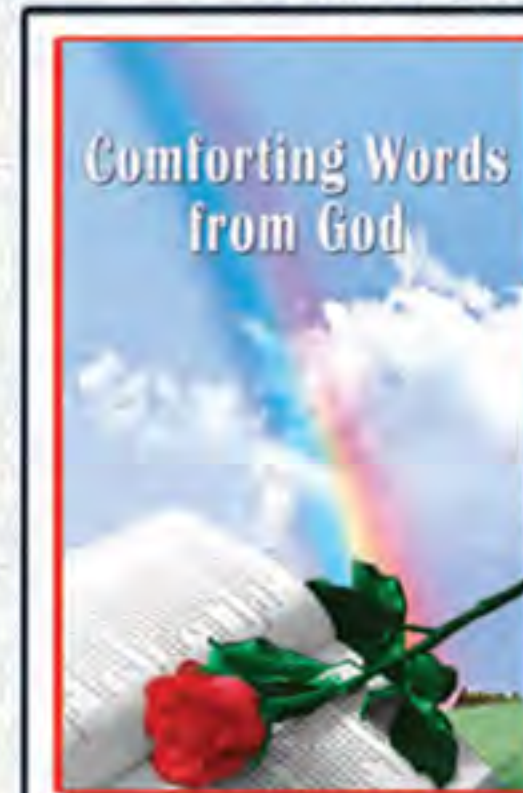
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What's in a Name?

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His person; **“And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call His NAME JESUS: for He shall save His people from their sins.”** (Mat-



thew 1:21). Jesus is the Greek form of the Hebrew name Joshua, meaning “savior”. He is the only One who can save the lost sinner; **“Neither**

is there salvation in any other: for there is none other NAME under Heaven given

among men, whereby we must be saved.” (Acts 4:12). What power is in His holy name!

If you have been saved through the shed blood of the Lord Jesus Christ **then you have been given a new name.** Just as Jacob's name in the Old Testament went from meaning “heel snatcher” to be Israel, or “**prince of God**”; When you receive Christ as Savior your name is changed from “**sinner**” to “**saint**”. “Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away” (James 4:14).

When someone said to my friend, “See you in a year,” it sounded odd when he replied, “**Yes, see you on the other side.**” He meant that he'd see him on the other side of a one-year deployment for the US Navy. But because the phrase is often used of Heaven, it made me think about the uncertainty of life. I wondered, Who will be here in another year? Who might by then be on the other side — in Heaven?

We certainly don't know what the next year — or hour — will bring. In his epistle, James wrote about this uncertainty. He rebuked the greedy merchants for boasting about what they would do that day, the next day, or even the next year (4:13). Their sin wasn't that they were making plans; it was forgetting God and arrogantly boasting about those business plans.

James reminded them: **“For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away”** (v.14).



Commentator Peter Davids says that James was pointing out their foolishness and saying, in essence, **“Come now, you who make plans—you don't even understand how little control you have over life itself.”**

No part of life is outside the control of God. So when we make plans, we need to remember, **“If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that”** (v.15).
