## Are you casting your care upon Jesus?

We're living in perilous times... Life's problems are growing as we journey through this uncertain world. Christians go to church with their troubles and cares and then leave taking their anxieties back home.

Some television and radio preachers falsely proclaim that, "unless you are rejoicing all the time, there is something wrong with you! There must be sin in your life and/or you're not right with God..."

I take them to Calvary, where we see Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane; "Then saith He unto them, **My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: tarry ye here, and watch with Me.** And He went a little further, and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, **O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me: nevertheless not as I will, but as Thou wilt.**" (Matt 26:38,39).

As our sinless Savior was crying in agony, "and His sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground" (Luke 22:44), **Jesus Christ was not rejoicing.** And there are times in our lives, when sudden crosses appear and make us cry out in dismay with troubled hearts! You don't carry a goofy smile plastered on your face all day. **It's not sinful to be sad!** So what should we do? The Bible says,



"Casting all your care upon Him; for He careth for you" (1 Peter 5:17).

### "CASTING" - Deliberate Act

The word casting is a verb, which implies some action is required. The Lord wants us to decisively take our troubles and cares and deposit them with Him. As by faith, we purposely trust God with our problems He will not neglect us. Take time to consider God's omnipotence. **Biblical men trusted God, and He was always faithful to care for them.** His eye is on the sparrow, and His eye is on you and me. His eye was on Elijah, and He sent the ravens to feed him. His eye was on David, even after his sin with Bathsheba

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## If Christ Returns in the Next Five Minutes...

In light of the fact that Jesus Christ is coming and could come for His own at any moment I want to say if you have not accepted Jesus Christ as your personal Savior, **please trust Him today!** There are two groups in the world: The saved and the lost. **If Jesus came in the next five minutes, everybody who has trusted Christ as Savior would leave the earth.**

Luke 17:34-36 says: **"I tell you, in that night there shall be two men in one bed, the one shall be taken, and the other shall be left. Two women shall be grinding together; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two men shall be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left."**

That is not spiritually speaking; that is actually, literally so. There will be two people at a mill grinding; one will leave and the other will be left behind. There will be two people in a field working; one will leave and the other will be left behind.

I have heard preachers spiritualize this passage and say that means that the new man inside will leave and the old body will be left behind. But the Bible does not teach that the bodies of Christians will be left behind. As a matter of fact, it teaches that the body will



be changed, not left. Says Philippians 3:20, 21: **"For our conversation [citizenship] is in Heaven; from whence also we look for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body."**

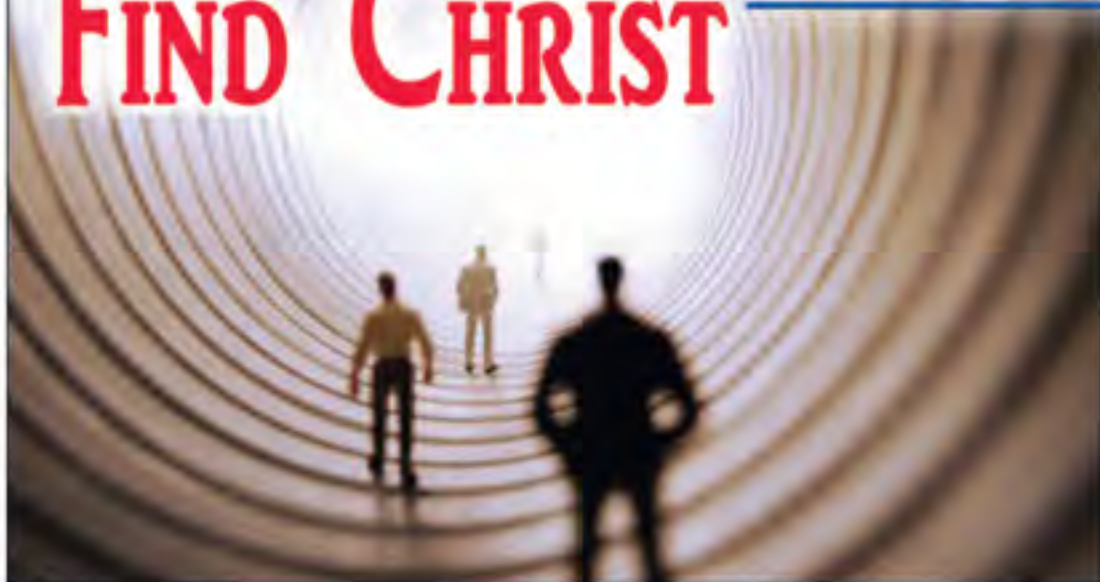
It says nothing about getting a new body and leaving the old one; it says **this vile body will be changed.** First John 3:2, **"Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when He shall appear, we shall be like Him; for we shall see Him as He is."**

**When the trumpet sounds, the saved will be caught up to meet the Lord in the air and the unsaved will be left.** The

**"And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgement."** Hebrews 9:27

Our text speaks of two inevitable events: **DEATH** and **JUDGMENT**. Some appointments may be postponed temporarily, others indefinitely, and a few even cancelled. However, our appointment with **DEATH** and **JUDGMENT** will never be postponed nor cancelled. It is definitely determined and cannot be evaded. These two events are the ones man would like most to escape. The certainty of death

and the uncertainty of life are the mightiest moral forces acting on man.

**The ancient Egyptians were wiser than we.** At every feast there was always one extraordinary guest who sat at the head of the table. He ate not, he drank not, he spake not, and he wore a veil. **He was a skeleton which they had placed there to warn them that even in their feasting they should REMEMBER there would be an end of life.**

We are so fond of living, so sad at the very thought of death that such a reminder as that would be quite unbearable in our days of feasting. The practical effect of a true meditation upon death would be exceedingly healthful to our spirits.

Thoughts of death would certainly help us to set proper value on things which we here possess. Perhaps they might lead us to set our affections upon things above and not upon the moldering things below. At any rate, thoughts of death and judgement

would keep us in check when we were about to sin.

We have only once to die and the day is fixed. If you "die wrong" the first time, you cannot come back to die better a second time. **If you die without Christ, you cannot come back to be converted and die a believer.** You have but once to die.

Oh, pray that you may find Christ before Death finds you! **"After this the judgement" -not "after this purgatory."** There is no further opportunity to be saved. **"After this the judgement."** As death leaves you, so judgment finds you. If you die unsaved, you will be so in the judgment. May I never see you at the left hand of Christ. If I do, you will remember how I warned you, besought you to come to the Lord Jesus.

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## Thank You Lord!

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and God took care of David... His eye was on Peter during his denial of Christ, and yet He kept His hand of blessing upon him. His eye is on you as you cast your cares upon Him! When you have problems, go to Him in prayer and turn over your cares to Him.

### "ALL YOUR CARE" - Defined Anxiety

As humans, we tend to worry. The Greek word for "care" in our text is also translated worry, and anxiety. Casting all..., that's why we find so much instruction in the Bible on trusting Christ with all of our troubles. **"Be**



**careful (anxious) for nothing; BUT IN EVERY THING by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God"** (Phil 4:6).

Cares, worries and anxieties torture us mentally. They distract us spiritually as we replay our fears on a "Memorex" loop tape mentally, over and over again. The devil can torment us psychologically like this. **We question God.** It was said, "Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist" (Matt 11:11). And yet John the Baptist showed his anxiety when he asked, **"Art thou He that should come? Or look we for another?"** (Luke 7:20)

Remember Christ's sermon on the mount, there He has instructed believers, **"Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? for your Heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of ALL THESE THINGS"** (Matt 6:31). Again we find the concept of entrusting all of our daily cares to Him! He loves His children.

### "UPON HIM" - Divine Advocate

The question arises, to whom do you cast your cares? Many look to psychiatrists, psychologists and government agencies for relief with their various burdens in life. Now to be sure, these all have their place, but **Christ should have the preeminence** when we need peace from life's troubles and storms. Your pastor loves you, but don't cast all your cares upon him, cast them upon Jesus Christ! Pastors can help to a point, but Jesus said, **"Come unto Me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest"** (Matt 11:28). He is God almighty, sovereign over all, and He cares for you. He has promised to help us with our cares, burdens,

worries and fears if we will look to Him. **"Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness"** (Isa 41:10).

Listen to me, don't try to figure out life's problems... you can't. I have my own list of cares as we each do. But anything that happens to you or me in this life has a divine purpose. "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory" (2Cor 4:17). Casting all your care upon whom? Peter answered that:

**"... Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life. And we believe and are sure that Thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God"** (John 6:68,69).

### "FOR HE CARETH FOR YOU"

#### - Definite Asset

Think about who it is that cares for you. I'm not speaking about just anybody with a shoulder to cry on. The **omnipotent One**, the One who **spoke this world into existence** out of nothing. The **One who controls** every movement of the planets, the stars and universe. The Lord Jesus Christ cares for you!

That's a tremendous blessing as we pass through this life. Depression settles in on all of us at some time or another. Between the world, the flesh and the devil we find ourselves in stormy waters not knowing what to do. But remember, as life's sea tosses you about, Jesus is with you and He cares! The disciples thought the Lord was neglecting them when **"there arose a great storm of wind, and the waves beat into the ship, so that it was now full. And He was in the hinder part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake Him, and say unto Him, Master, carest thou not that we perish?"** (Mark 4:37,38).

In faithless desperation we too sometimes cry out, **"Does anybody care?"** The LORD always comes and rebukes the winds and waves in our lives, because He careth for you! Family and friends can be wonderful help and support, but no one ever cared for me or you like Jesus. **Do you know Him?**

Casting is a deliberate act. When you get in a car with another driver, you cast all of your care upon that driver. When you choose to get on an airplane you cast all of your care upon the unseen pilot in the cockpit. **When you get in Christ, you cast all of your care upon Him to care for you and get you to Heaven!** You cannot have the peace of God until you have made peace with God by receiving Him as your personal Savior!

As your sacrifice and substitute, He made it possible for you to be saved from your sin. Why don't you give Him your thanks right now? Then determine

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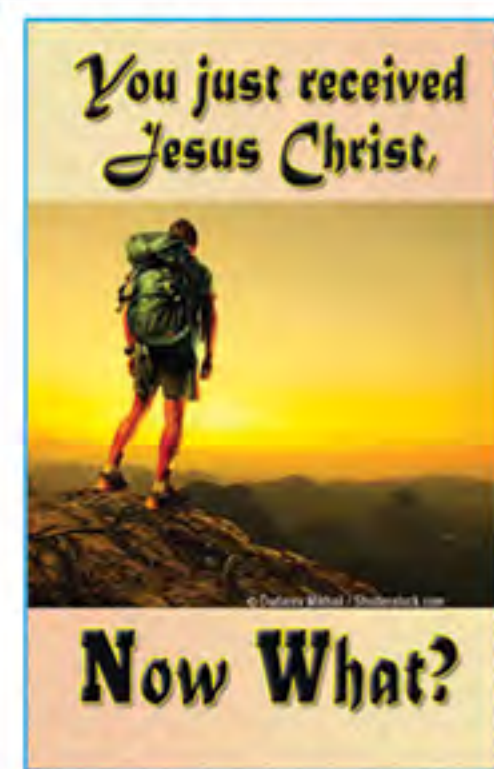

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unsaved who are left could be divided into two groups: **those who have heard the Gospel** and had an opportunity to be saved, and **those who have NEVER heard** the Gospel and have not had an opportunity to be saved. Those who have heard the Gospel and could have trusted Christ as Savior but rejected Him will have their destiny sealed. A person who heard the Gospel and had an opportunity to be saved before the rapture of the church will not have an opportunity to be saved after the rapture. But those who had never heard the Gospel will have such an opportunity.

Notice II Thessalonians 2:7, 8: **"For the mystery of iniquity doth already work: only he who now letteth [hindereth] will let [hinder], until he be taken out of the way. And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming."**

Verse 10 continues, **"And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; [notice] BECAUSE they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved."** Why do they perish? Because they "received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved."

Now, notice verses 11 and 12: **"And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all**

**might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness."** That is the Word of God!

Here the Bible says those who heard the Gospel but "received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved," would be sent a strong delusion "because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved."

There are two groups in the world at this moment: the saved and the lost. **If Jesus comes in the next five minutes, the saved will be caught out; the unsaved will be left behind.**

The unsaved who have heard the Gospel and had an opportunity to be saved will be given a "strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness." When they had an opportunity to trust Christ, they rejected Him; therefore the Bible says their destiny is sealed.

Let me remind you again that if you have heard the Gospel, and had an opportunity to trust Christ, you will NOT have an opportunity to be saved after Christ returns!

If you have never trusted Christ as your personal Savior, please trust Him today. In the words of Matthew 24:44, **"Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh."** It could be today!

## What kind of Christ knocks on your heart?

**"Behold I stand at the door and knock"** (Revelation 3:20). What kind of a Christ is this who stands at the hearts' door of lost people and knocks?

come to your home and knock on your door and you would refuse to let that neighbor in as you have refused the Son of God, you would lose a friend. But Jesus comes to your hearts' door again and again and patiently knocks...

Then, notice, that He is a **FORGIVING SAVIOUR**. You remember once a woman was taken in the very act of adultery and the mob was about to stone

her to death. Yes, she had sinned, she deserved to be punished but she had a **FORGIVING SAVIOUR** to knock on her hearts' door. She let Him in and He forgave her.

Notice finally, that He is an **ADEQUATE CHRIST**. I simply mean that He is able to meet every need of your life. We aren't serving a dead Christ, we aren't serving a powerless Saviour, NO, we are serving a resurrected, living, powerful, matchless Saviour. One who is able to save unto the uttermost, one who is able to keep me saved throughout the endless ages of eternity, and one, thank God, who can satisfy my soul. If you never have opened your heart and life to Christ, won't you answer Him now as He knocks? Invite Jesus to come in...

## Guilty of Plenty...

“And the grace of our LORD was exceeding abundant with faith and love which is in Christ Jesus. The grace of our Lord was exceedingly abundant” (1 Timothy 1:14). —

A man was filling out a job application when he came to the question “Have you ever been arrested?” He wrote, “No.”

The next question, intended for people who had answered “Yes” to the previous question, was “Why?” The applicant answered it anyway: “I never got caught.” He evidently knew he was guilty of plenty!

So was the apostle Paul. He knew he had personally done wrong and sinned against God. He wrote, “I was before a blasphemer, and a persecutor, and injurious: but I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in unbelief.” (1 Timothy 1:13). He even called himself the “chief” of sinners (v.15).

We too were once separated from the Lord because of our sin and were considered His enemies. “For if, when we



were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by His life” (Romans 5:10). But when we confessed our sin and acknowledged our need for His forgiveness, He cleansed us and made us new.

Those of us who have known the Lord for many years may have the tendency to forget what we’ve been rescued from and forgiven of. Sharing about our past and current failures and giving praise to God for forgiveness will help us not to come across as “holier-than-thou” to people who don’t yet know the Lord.

## Going to Heaven; Because I'm a Good Person...

When I once asked a lady if she were sure she would go to Heaven when she died, she replied, “I live a good life.” When I asked a man that same question, he said, “Well, I’m not too bad.” Both were trusting their good life to get them to Heaven.

Now I am all for good living. One should live as clean, moral, pure and as righteous as he possibly can; but no one goes to Heaven on his own righteousness. The Apostle Paul said concerning his own people,

“For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God’s righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God” (Romans 10:2,3).

He goes on to say in verse 4, “For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone that believeth.”

Jesus said, “I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance” (Mark 2:17). One would be just as safe trusting his sins to get him to Heaven as he would trusting his righteousness. The Bible says in Isaiah 64:6, “But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as ‘filthy rags.’ Notice the language of this text, ‘... all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags.’ God does not accept any of our righteous acts as a hope of Heaven. He didn’t say our sins but our righteousnesses are as filthy rags.

Suppose a man could turn over a new leaf and never sin again, that he could live righteous until the day he dies. Then would he go to Heaven? Absolutely not! His righteous living today cannot undo his sinful past. The truth is, no one is righteous. The Bible says in Romans 3:10, “As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one.” And verse

23 says, “All have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.”

The only righteousness that God accepts is His own imputed righteousness.

When we trust Jesus Christ as Saviour, God imputes to us, that is, credits to our account, the very righteousness of God. That is what Romans 10:10 says, “For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness.” The moment we trust Jesus Christ as Saviour, God accounts us righteous in His sight. Understand that, digest that Biblical truth!

Romans 4:5 promises, “But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for

righteousness.” The Scripture says in Romans 4:3, “Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness.”

One who is trusting in his good life or his own righteousness to be saved has a false hope of Heaven. “Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost” (Titus 3:15). If you are trusting in your own good life to get you to Heaven, then I urge you to pray and tell the Lord that there is no way you can be righteous enough to deserve Heaven; therefore, you will trust Him completely for God’s imputed righteousness through the blood of Christ.

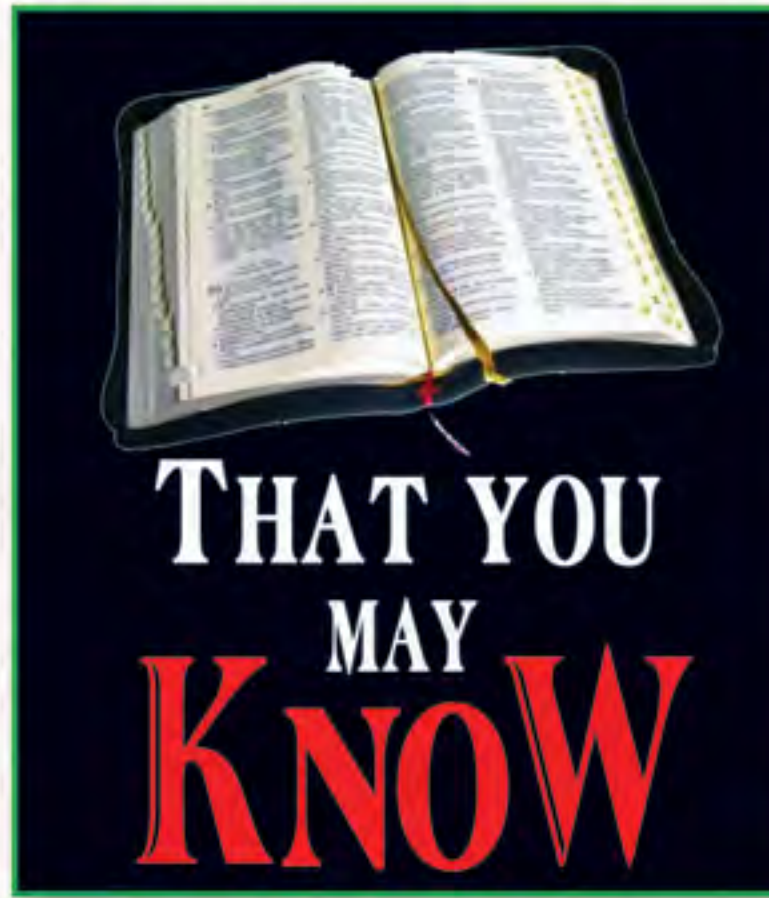

## Security of the Believer
